



Geography Learning Journey - Oceans and Seas		Reception Summer Term 2	
Key Question- What is the UK, what does it look like on the map and what surrounds her?			
Theme Overview		Project Outcomes	
In this geography unit, the children will look at a map of the UK and discuss the bodies of water which surrounds her.		To be able to correctly label some of the seas and oceans which surround the UK on a wall map.

Sequence of Learning			
<p>Lesson 1 LI: To look at the UK on a map</p> <p>Can you remember where we live? We live in a village called Burghfield. Show this on a map on the IWB, then slowly zoom out to the UK. Tell children we live in England, and England has two other countries next to it - Wales and Scotland. Together they make up Great Britain. GB is an island; it has water all around it. There is water inside too-rivers, lakes, streams, ponds etc. Therefore, it has a coast all around it too.</p> <p>Look at a wall map of the UK and introduce Northern Ireland too. These four countries make up the UK. Label the 4 countries using physical labels as a class (e.g. post it notes)</p>		<p>Lesson 2 LI: To look at the UK on a map and begin to name the countries and oceans/seas</p> <p>Show the map of the UK again. What is this? Recap learning from last week- that GB is an island which is surrounded by coastline and water, that 4 countries make up the UK. Look at all the water surround the UK- we need to know what the names of these bodies of water are. Tell children the difference between a sea and an ocean. Teach children the names of the 4 seas/oceans surrounding the UK and physically label them. Learn the countries of the UK song.</p>
