<ul> <li>Talk about what is important to them and others, valuing themselves, reflecting on their own feelings and experiences and developing a sense of belonging.</li> <li><b>RE at Bland's Infant School:</b> <ul> <li>It is vital for all our children to learn from and about religion, so that they can understand the world around them.</li> <li>RE promotes respect and openmindedness towards others with different faiths and beliefs and encourages children to develop their sense of identity and belonging through selfawareness and reflection.</li> </ul> </li> <li>We encourage children to ask questions to promote enquirybased learning.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>about different types of superheroes e.g. nurses etc.</li> <li>Read the story 'George Saves the World By Lunchtime' George Saves The World By Lunchtime 'George Saves The World By Lunchtime - YouTube</li> <li>Why did George need to save/rescue the world? What problems does the world face? How can they be solved? Can they be solved by superheroes like Spiderman? How could YOU help to solve the problems shown in this story? (be kinder, more considerate, less wasteful, share)</li> <li>Explain to the children that Christians believe that God sent Jesus to save/help the world and they look forward to Christmas as the time of his birth. (Make sure Jesus is not seen as a superhero by emphasising that God thought the world needed someone to 'save it', so Jesus came to help people see what they could do to make the world better.</li> <li>Introduce the key question and review the LI.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>book depicts. Who is the cause of all these problems?</li> <li>Recap Christian belief that God gave Jesus to the world to help save/rescue it. Therefore Christians look forward to the Christian celebration of Christmas as a time to remember and celebrate when Jesus was born.</li> <li>Discuss how Christians prepare for Christmas- advent calendars/candles as a countdown to mark Christmas day, when Jesus was born.</li> <li>Look at the slides of different advent calendars and discuss which ones Christians might use, to show the story of the nativity.</li> <li>Read a story of the nativity and ask children to spot the scenes on the calendars.</li> <li>Break the story down into 6 main parts and split the class into 6 parts. Each group to create one window of a class advent calendar and put them all together once complete.</li> <li>Add a photo to the class book of learning.</li> <li>Review the key question and the Ll.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Christians believe that Jesus is God in human form so He has God's love and power and does not need magical powers. Introduce the term incarnation.</li> <li>Recap bible stories that we have shared that show examples of Jesus showing love and kindness e.g. story of The Good Samaritan <u>The Good Samaritan - Holy Tales Bible Stories - Parables of Jesus Christ - YouTube</u></li> <li>What was Jesus teaching through His actions? (That kindness and love will save the world.)</li> <li>Therefore, Christians believe that God gave Jesus to the world as a gift. Jesus was pure and good and he came to show Christian how to live a better life.</li> <li>Do you have to be a Christian to behave in some of the ways Jesus portrayed? Eg: being kind to others, not retaliating etc</li> <li>Review the Key question and LI.</li> </ul>

<b>Gift:</b> Something given to someone <b>Incarnation:</b> God in human form. the God's teachings from an entity th how to live a good life by someone t	<ul> <li>Glossary:</li> <li>Christmas story: The Story told by Christians about the birth of Jesus - also known as The Nativity.</li> <li>Gift: Something given to someone willingly and that someone does not have to pay for.</li> <li>Incarnation: God in human form. Jesus was born flesh and bones and born on Earth. People struggled to understand the God's teachings from an entity they could not see and strayed. He came to Earth as Jesus so people could be taught how to live a good life by someone they could relate to.</li> <li>Save: to keep someone or something safe from harm.</li> </ul>
