Governor News

What Do the School Governors Do?

Arguably, one of our most important responsibilities is to recruit the Headteacher. Once we've recruited the Headteacher we hand over the day-to-day running of the school to her/him. This means that ordinarily, governors don't get involved in the nitty gritty of daily tasks, however we do come into the school on agreed occasions to see what's going on and ensure the children are safe, happy and receiving a broad, exciting education that makes them want to come to school.

The governors also come into school in the evening and during the school day to attend meetings with the Headteacher and Deputy Headteacher and sometimes other senior staff. These meetings allow governors to question the senior leaders about the performance of the school, asking for evidence to support their answers. Governors' questioning covers all aspects of school life, whether it be the safety and well-being of the children, the children's achievements, the management of staff, the running and agreement of the school budget, the maintenance of the school premises and more besides. We also offer support to the Headteacher in many ways as we acknowledge that it is a very demanding role. Governors come from different backgrounds with diverse vocational experiences and their ideas, skills and knowledge can help with strategic planning and decision making.

Governors' meetings also involve the review and adoption of policies and procedures that provide the framework for the way in which the school is run. We also decide the direction of travel of the school, for example, what sort of school we want Mrs Bland's to be to best meet the needs of all of our pupils.

If you're interested in finding out more about the work of the governors, we have a dedicated area on the school website with more information, or please feel free to contact the clerk to governors via the school office. We're currently looking for more governors to join the board and soon we'll be holding a parent governor election. We're also looking to recruit new governors from the wider community who aren't necessarily parents or have a direct association with the school, but who are community-minded and have an interest in helping the next generation of children get the most out of their time at Mrs Bland's.

Little Acorns Pre-Nursery

This week in Little Acorns we have been reading the story 'Brown Bear, Brown Bear' by Eric Carle, the children loved listening to the story and seeing the unusual coloured animals. We have had lots of colour matching activities this week inside and outdoors and the children are becoming very confident at naming the different colours. For snack time this week the children enjoyed making Teddy bear bread. They learnt different knife skills of chopping and spreading. The children had turns at chopping bananas and spreading chocolate spread. They were all very excited to eat their snack! We have enjoyed learning how to move our whole bodies to music as we danced in the hall this week.

Acorn (Nursery am and pm)

This week the children have been learning the story of 'Mouse Paint'. The children enjoyed learning about colour mixing and how to make green, orange and purple. In the art area the children explored how to make the colours independently and some children made up their own colours!

This week we have done a science experiment to see what would happened to sweets if we put them in water. The children loved watching the colours come off and into the water. 'It's like magic!!'

Maple and Beech News (Reception)

We are continuing to explore different traditional fairy tales and this week our book is 'The Three Billy Goats Gruff'. The children have been telling the story using puppets and joining in with the repeating phrases. Next week we are going to use these patterns to help us change the story!

In Maths we have been filling containers with rice and describing how much there is using words like full, empty, half full, nearly empty. Can you practise using these words at home over the weekend?

We have also been thinking about how to stay safe online and when we are out and about and recapped on how to stay safe near the road and what to do about strangers.

Remember next Monday we have our walk around the local area and then our fairy tale tea party in the afternoon. Can children please bring their costumes in a named bag to change into at lunch time.

A final plea, if anyone can help on our Rushall Farm trip on the 3rd March please come and talk to Mrs Pettifer or Mrs Wilby. We need to have a 1:4 ratio and at the moment we do not have enough helpers.

Birch and Cherry (Year 1)

This week in English we have been writing the story of Goldilocks and the Three Bears, making our own innovations as we go along. We have tried very hard to use full stops and capitals in most of our sentences and adding a little extra detail to engage our readers. In maths we have been practising counting in multiples of 10 and doubling numbers. Practising these skills regularly at home would be hugely beneficial!

In Science we have been looking at our pinecones from last week and thinking about the results. We have been relearning the 12 months of the year and thinking about what season they belong to. We have also been learning about what a deciduous tree does in the different seasons. I wonder if you can spot any early signs of Spring yet? Last week in DT we designed our moving picture showing a scene from 'The Billy Goat's Gruff' and this week we have been making them, ensuring that we are following our design criteria. We evaluated them at the end. Perhaps you could make your own moving picture at home? In Geography we have been looking at maps of the school and in RE we have been thinking about how Jesus was a good friend. What a busy week!

Cherry Class would love some parent volunteers to hear readers...please?! It doesn't have to be a regular slot, a one off would be appreciated too, and you can come in at most times of the day, even if it is for half an hour. Please come and speak to us to arrange a slot. Many thanks.

Hazel and Rowan News (Year 2)

This week in English, Year 2 have been identifying and using homophones correctly. Can they tell you which homophone we have been practicing this week? They have also been inspired by George's Marvellous Medicine and have been describing the effects it has on Grandma. Maybe they could tell you what they would put in their own marvellous medicine.

In Maths, the children have worked in teams to solve word problems involving fractions and are now able to find ½, 1/4, 1/3 and ¾'s of amounts. Can they tell you how to find three quarters of 20? They have also ended the week with our half termly tests, showing us just how hard they have been working this term!

In our history lessons over the last few weeks we have been looking at famous nurses through history and all the muck and mess they had to overcome! Can the children tell you any facts about the three different nurses we have learnt about?

Breakfast Bees and Bland's Bumblebees (Before and After School Club)


