



Maths:

- Go on a shape hunt around your house and garden. What 2D shapes can you find? (Triangles, squares, circles, rectangles etc) Can you spot any 3D shapes? (Cubes, cuboid, sphere, pyramid, cone) Make a tally chart for each one.
- Make maths fun. Use sweets or treats or Easter eggs to add and subtract. If you have 3 sweets but I give you 4 more, how many do you have now? How many sweets will you have left if take 2?
- Create a snack shop at home. Earn money at home and use it for your snack shop. How much change will you need? How much money do you have left? How much money do you need for an apple and a biscuit? (see images)



Literacy:

- Make and write Easter cards or Cheer up cards.
- Listen to a grown up read your favourite story. Make a poster about your favourite character or favourite part in the story.
- Read a book on Oxford Owl, free e-library of books; just sign up with your email grown-ups.

- Draw a picture of your sunflower in your sunflower diary, label the different parts of the plant, e.g. stem, leaves, roots, flower etc.
- Go around the house on a sound hunt, can you find 5 objects with the sound 'T' or 'CH'. Write a list of what you have found?
- Go outside, if safe to do so, and fill up a bag of different natural objects e.g. daisy, grass, stick, leaf, etc. What have you found? Make a list or stick them to some paper and label them.
- Find out about the Christian Easter story or other Easter stories e.g. We are going on an egg hunt. Make your own special 'last supper' what would you have for your special meal?
- Where do chicks come from? How could you find out? (look online or non fiction books)

Understanding the World:

- Log in to Purple Mash and access different activities on the alert bar.
- If safe to go outside can you build a bug hotel or nest. What will the animals needs?
- Set up a toy car wash; clean the dirty cars, or animals or babies.
- Make a bird feeder.
- Match images of baby animals to their mums, can you name them e.g. sheep and lamb.

Physical Development- Gross Motor

How many times can you bounce the ball, with one hand, two hands?

Stand on one foot and balance. How many seconds can you balance for? Can you beat your record?

Make up a silly animal dance, jump like a frog, hop like a bunny, flap like a chick, slither like a slug etc.

Fine motor

Cutting skills- cut out 2D shapes or different types of line e.g. straight, wavy, zig-zag, curved etc.

Can you make your own bed?

Can you help make dinner/lunch?

Can you set the table? Help wash up?

If you can get in the garden can you help pull up weeds? Plant new plants?
