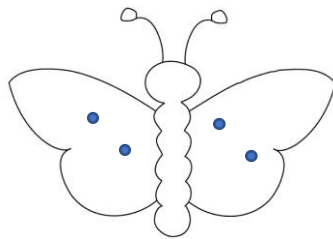




Maths: Set up a teddy bear's picnic. Can you share the picnic food equally between your teddy bears? You could share real or pretend food items. You could help an adult chop some fruit into equal size pieces if it is safe to do so.

- Share lego blocks or counters equally between yourself and one other person in your home. Count the blocks to make sure you both have the same number.
- Can you share playdough equally between yourself and another person in your home? Discuss the different ways you can make sure you have shared the playdough fairly.
- Draw a butterfly template. Decorate one of the butterfly's wings using circles. Count the number of circles on the wing. Now draw the same number of circles on the other wing. You have doubled the first number of circles. What number did you double? How many circles were there after you doubled them?



$2 + 2 = 4$
Double 2 is 4

Literacy:

- Talk to your adult about the different places the characters travelled in the book 'We're going on a bear hunt'. Which would be your favourite place? Why? Where would you least like to travel?
- Can you think of a different ending for the story? What else might they discover in the cave? Perhaps the big, shiny nose could belong to a puppy!
- Draw a front cover for the story 'We're going on a bear hunt'. Write some labels to show where the characters have been, for example 'long, wavy grass'.



Understanding the World

-Talk about the different people who help us. Discuss why lots of people have made rainbows to say thank you to all the people who work for the NHS. Go for a walk and count all the Rainbows you can see (if it is safe to do so),

-Draw a picture of someone who has helped you. Write or talk about how they helped you.

-Can you use technology in your home to find a picture of a real rainbow? Ask an adult to help you find a suitable



website.

Physical Development

Gross Motor

-Build a reading den using blankets and other materials in your home. Share a story in your reading den. Think about how you can travel safely while carrying the materials.

Imagine you are the bear in the cave. How might you move?

Fine motor

-Paint some dry pasta in the different colours of the rainbow. When they have dried, thread them onto string to

make a bracelet for someone special.

- Make a poster to show all the different ways you can look after yourself. Think about all the things you can do to keep yourself healthy and safe, for example by eating healthily.
