School News

Year 2 had a wonderful visit to Oxford Castle and have been busy writing about their visit. Some of the children enjoyed reading their recounts to me.

We have shown several prospective parents around school, via Zoom, and they have all been very impressed with all the work the children were doing. This is something new for us, but so far has worked well and some children have been confident to share their work and answer questions as part of our 'virtual' tour.

Outdoor learning in Autumn 2

The children have been enjoying a wide range of activities on-site for outdoor learning in Autumn 1. In Autumn 2, Years 1 and 2 will be returning to the woods as well as continuing to develop their outdoor skills on-site. In weeks 2, 4 and 6 we will be looking for parent volunteers in Years 1 and 2 to accompany them to the woods. If you have not helped before you will need to contact the office to complete an induction. If you have helped before, you will still need to contact the office to be updated with the COVID procedures.

Year 1 Birch – Friday afternoon (13/11, 27/11, 11/12) – leaving at 1.00, returning for home time at 3.

Year 1 Cherry – Monday afternoon (9/11, 23/11, 7/12) – leaving at 1.00, returning for home time at 3.10.

Year 2 Hazel – Thursday afternoon (12/11, 26/11, 10/12) - leaving at 1.30, returning for home-time at 3.10

Year 2 Rowan – Tuesday afternoon (10/11, 24/11, 8/12) - leaving at 1.30, returning for home-time at 3.00

This year we will <u>not</u> be able to supply spare wellies and waterproofs to children to go to the woods due to Covid restrictions. Children will need to bring their own waterproof trousers and wellies or they will not be able to go to the woods unfortunately. Nursery and Reception will continue with on-site outdoor learning with a view to using the woods in the Spring term.

Little Acorns Pre-Nursery

What spooky fun we have had this week. We have been enjoying lots of Halloween themed activities in the nursery such as making a witch's brew in the water table, practising our scooping, pouring and stirring skills.

We have been hammering golf tees in pumpkins outside and matching ghost numbers in Maths.

The children have settled into nursery life so well this term, we are very proud of them all.

If you find a spare moment over half term please do continue practising on counting, colour names and singing along to your child's favourite nursery rhyme.

Acorn (Nursery am and pm)

We are really proud of the way the Acorns children have settled in so well to Nursery this half term, well done to all of them!

The children have enjoyed the stories about brothers, sisters and Grandparents this week. We have been learning about the s/a/t/p letter sounds - see if your child can sing along to these phonics songs at home https://vimeo.com/76605648 We have been practising counting carefully at times like snack time, counting how many children have got bananas/apples/oranges etc.

Next term our topic will be 'Why are leaves crispy?' and we will be learning about leaves and trees changing in Autumn, as well as learning about nocturnal animals. We hope you all have a lovely half term break!

Maple and Beech News (Reception)

This week in Maths we have been learning about repeating patterns.

The children have been identifying what the pattern is and then continuing it. We have tried it with colours, objects and shapes.

Maybe you could have a go at making a pattern using natural objects such as the one above? The children have enjoyed writing their name and house numbers on envelopes which they then posted in our post box in school. Maybe over the holidays you could see if they can remember some more of your address and write a letter, draw a picture and post it to your friends or family.

We have found out about the Harvest festival and read a story from the bible – Moses and the bullrushes, and talked about our own families, thinking about how people are special and how we can celebrate and give thanks.

We have started looking at internet safety with the children. This website www.childnet.com has a really useful section for parents with online safety tools and advice for different ages.

We would like to say how proud we are of all the children in Reception in how they have adapted and learnt so many new things this term. We have put some 'wow moment' sheets in their book bags if you could write something you have noticed that your child is able to do at home we can add it to their learning journeys. We hope you all have a restful half term and come back ready and refreshed to start our new topic 'Let's Celebrate!'

Birch and Cherry (Year 1)

In maths in Year 1 this week the children have been learning about 2D shape. They have been on shape hunts, made shapes from sticks and made shape pictures too! In English the children have made a timeline, marking on toys from the past and the present, and continuing their discussion about their similarities and differences. They have also been learning the days of the week in order, and practising to write them, remembering the capital letter at the front. Perhaps you could make a sign at home and ask your child to write what day it is! We have done a lot of Design and Technology this week to design, make and evaluate a chair for Baby Bear. The children have worked so hard this half term and we are impressed with how they have made the transition from Foundation Stage to Year 1. Next half term our topic will be 'From Infinity to Beyond,' concentrating especially on Neil Armstrong. I wonder if over half term you could find out some interesting facts about him, or look

up some information about one of the planets? Don't forget to keep up with your reading over half term. Have fun, stay safe and we will see you in November!

We are so proud of the way Year 2 behaved on our trip to Oxford Castle, they represented the school fantastically and impressed the tour guides with their Castle knowledge!


