## **Little Acorns Pre-Nursery**

Well done Little Acorns, we have made it to the last week of term. A very big well done to all of you.

This week we have enjoyed learning about the celebration of Chinese New Year. We read the story of Peppa Pig's Chinese New Year, discovering how and why is it celebrated. We also watched a clip from CBeebies and saw some wonderful parades and dancing.

We got creative and made our own Chinese Lanterns, working on our pencil control and scissor work.

This week we also talked about the different types of weather and you helped me decide which weather symbol needed to be displayed on my weather board. We enjoyed a sing a long together with the nursery rhyme basket too. Thank you for sending in your photos and videos of you enjoying the Seesaw activities at home.

#### Acorn (Nursery am and pm)

Well done to all the Acorns children both in school and at home for being so enthusiastic and for trying so hard with all their learning this half term! This week we have been learning about and exploring how Chinese New Year is celebrated through the eyes of children. We have made Chinese lanterns and dragon models, re-enacted the story of the 12 animals having a race to decide who the New Year would be named after, and had a Chinese restaurant in our role play area! We have also had fun exploring all the ice, freezing toy animals and natural objects in ice, finding out about how the ice melts, and making a small world ice skating rink. Next half term we will be exploring about the theme 'Are Eggs Alive?'.

## **Maple and Beech News (Reception)**

This week in Maths we have learnt about 2D and 3D shapes. The children have started to use the properties to describe shapes they have found in their environment, using words like straight, curved, sides, edges and corners. In Literacy the children have been creating their own monsters using different media, thinking about where they might live, what they might eat and who could defeat them.

In topic we have tried to identify natural and man-made objects in the world around us, talked about safe and unsafe strangers linked to stories and continued to practise our football skills.

We would like to say how proud we are of all the children this term and how they have coped and adapted to remote learning and those that have come into school adapting to the changes in place. We wish you a restful half term and look forward to our new topic 'Things that Grow'.

# **Birch and Cherry (Year 1)**

This week we have been busy writing our stories based on the book, 'Handa's Surprise'. We concentrated on using adjectives for description and tried hard to remember to use full stops and capital letters in the correct places. In maths we have been learning about ordinal numbers.

Despite the cold this week, we have seen some spring flowers beginning to grow at school, and we have looked carefully at the different parts of daffodils. We have been careful not to step on the crocuses which have started to grow in the middle of our outside area! We have made a map of the street, remembering to draw it from an aerial view, and have also continued to practise our football skills.

#### **Hazel and Rowan News (Year 2)**

This week in writing, the children have been doing work based around the Chinese story 'The Magic Paintbrush'. They have answered comprehension questions about it, trying hard to write in full sentences, and acted it out. The children have then drawn and labelled their own story maps, then written their own lovely versions of the story, using descriptive language. Some children have also challenged themselves by changing one small detail in the story. It's also been great hearing some of the children reading their stories on Teams this week.

In maths, Year 2 have been learning how to divide by sharing and grouping, both practically and by recording as pictures and division sentences. They have also recapped work on odd and even numbers, and learnt how to divide numbers by 2, 5 and 10.

In history, the children have been recapping what they've learnt about the three nurses, Florence Nightingale, Mary Seacole and Edith Cavell, and compared them, looking for similarities and differences. As Chinese New Year starts this week, they have enjoyed learning some facts about China and Chinese New Year too, as well as creating a messy art display and singing along with Mr Corker on his guitar.

We're very proud of how hard all the children have worked this term, and hope you have an enjoyable half-term break!
