Little Acorns Pre-Nursery

A very warm welcome back to you all.

The children have been fantastic at stepping back into nursery life. It was so lovely to see their smiling faces and to see the nursery full of life again.

We have spent the week playing and having fun, remembering how to treat each other with kindness and respect.

We made the most of the sunshine at the beginning of the week and enjoyed the garden area. We explored in the sand pit, we chased bubbles around the garden and made mud pies in the mud kitchen.

We have begun work on our nature garden this week and the children have helped to create a bug hotel using recycled materials collected from around the school site. If out on a walk this weekend and you happen to find any interesting natural bits such as pine cones. large stones please do feel free to bring them in.

Acorn (Nursery am and pm)

Well done to all the children returning to Acorns this week, they have settled back into Nursery routines so well! A big well done as well to the children who have just started Nursery for the first time as well! This week we have enjoyed playing and talking to each other, and we have done lots of circle time activities. We have also continued with our 'Are Eggs Alive?' topic and have revised what we have been learning about how eggs hatch, the life cycle of an egg, and what eggs are used for.

Next week we will be learning about other farm animals through the Farmer Duck story, and retelling the story with small world animals. We will be revising the s/a/t/p/i/n letter sounds and practising blending these sounds together to read words. We will also be making repeating patterns with natural objects, e.g. leaf/stick/leaf/stick.

We will be doing Outdoor Learning every Wednesday if your child could wear old clothes and bring a waterproof coat and wellies (or they can leave their wellies in school all week if they have a spare pair). Please can you make sure all their uniform, coats and water bottles are named as it makes it much easier to find missing items! Thank you.

Maple and Beech News (Reception)

It has been fantastic to welcome all the children back this week and they have settled back into school amazingly well. Thank you for all the hard work you have done with them at home during lockdown. They have great at sharing some of the work they did at home and their feelings about returning to school.

This week we have been reading the story of 'The Enormous Turnip'. The children have acted out the story, drawn story maps and had a go at writing some of the words and sentences from the story.

In maths we have focused on the numbers 6, 7 and 8, really exploring the patterns we can make with each number. We used dominoes to help us with this. If you have them at home they are very helpful for children in recognising patterns of numbers. We explored what makes a healthy meal and talked about the different food groups and why it is important to have a variety in our diet. We also explored using vegetables to make models of animals.

Some reminders: Children need to wear their outdoor clothes on Monday (Beech) and Tuesday (Maple) and all children need a pair of wellies in school each day. Also for girls wearing tights, please can they have a pair of socks in their PE bag to change into on PE days. PE days are Wednesday and Friday.

Birch and Cherry (Year 1)

Well what a fantastic first week back! The children came into school brilliantly with lots of smiles and eager to learn. We hope that the parents have all enjoyed the break from home schooling.

This week in English we have continued with writing information leaflets. The children could choose which woodland creature they would like to write about. We found clips, photos and information using the internet and information books to help us find the information needed. We have enjoyed learning about what animals come from different continents.

In Maths we have been continuing with measuring and we have been using rulers to help us measure objects and draw our own lines.

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Ne have continued with our Friday Quiz as the children really enjoyed it during home schooling. We hope that all the Mum's have a fantastic day on Sunday and that you like the cards we have made.

Hazel and Rowan News (Year 2)

It has been so lovely to welcome back some very excited Year 2's this week. We have talked a lot about how we feel about being back in school and also had lots of time to play with our friends!

In writing, we have continued to write and develop our fact files, thinking about imaginary flowers and how we can make them realistic and exciting! We have been thinking about the vocabulary we use to describe the flowers and making sure it is detailed so you can picture the flower exactly!

In maths, we have continued to learn about 2D and 3D shapes. We have sorted 2d shapes based on their properties and worked hard to make sure we can count and recall the correct amount of vertices, edges and faces on 3D shapes. In Outdoor learning we have been on plant hunts to find out what is growing around the school. Ask us if we can tell you any flowers that are growing in our outdoor area!

Our P.E days have now gone back to the usual Monday afternoon and Tuesday morning so please make sure P.E kits are in school on these days.

Rowan's Outdoor learning day is Tuesday and Hazel's is Thursday. Children can come in dressed in their outdoor learning clothes on these days.
