Little Acorns Pre-Nursery

Despite the weathers attempt to spoil our fun this week in Little Acorns we enjoyed many outdoor activities. We continued our visits to 'Big Nursery' exploring their outdoor area and meeting the children's new teachers. On Wednesday we had lots of fun having our own mini sports morning. We enjoyed running races, seeing who could jump the furthest with our long jump, and throwing bean bags into hoops to see who could score the highest amount. The children enjoyed exploring the activities set out this week which included, naming shapes for our shape sorter, counting out compare bears and testing our problem-solving skills with a number puzzle. In the small world we had a mini construction site with diggers, sand and rocks. Our story this week was '3 Billy Goats Gruff'- which led on from last week's maths where we talked about names for different sizes such as 'big, medium and small'.

Acorns Nursery

This week we have been learning about 'Mighty Machines' as part of our topic 'How does that building stay up?' and we have been talking about how trucks and lorries carry bricks to build houses. The children were very interested in cement mixers and we talked about how the cement makes the bricks stick together - see if your child can do a brick rubbing at home. We have been rolling toy vehicles wheels in paint and making patterns with them, and building different road tracks for vehicles. We made a 'car wash' outside and gave the bikes and scooters a good clean using sponges and cloths! In maths we learnt about 3D shapes and built them from polydrons. Have a look at Seesaw for our sports day videos! Next week we are learning about the '3 Billy Goats Gruff' story.

We have been working hard writing our names and practising an effective pencil grip - have a look at the links and activities I have put on Seesaw!

Maple and Beech News (Reception)

In maths this week we have been looking at problem solving. We have used different stories to pose problems – how many dinosaurs are left in Harry's bucket if a certain number fall out; how many animals or people could be in Noah's ark if there are 10 legs altogether. The children have been very good at explaining their reasoning.

In English we been reading Bible stories linked to our RE. We have read the story of Noah's ark and sequenced the story. We have also read the story of Jonah and the whale and written a postcard from Jonah describing his experience.

In outdoor learning we did a treasure hunt, finding a stash of lollipops. In our creative area we have been really impressed with their perseverance trying to sew.

In computing we have animated ourselves in various seaside poses, have a look on Seesaw.

Next week for outdoor learning we are learning through beach themed water play activities. Please ensure that your child has spare clothes, especially socks, as they will get wet!

Birch and Cherry News (Year 1)

In year 1 this week we have been reading the story 'Katie in London'. We have written postcards to describe our own imaginary trip to London and all the interesting landmarks that we saw.

In maths we have been learning about money, what the coins and notes look like and their different values.

We have continued to make our models of London landmarks using different joining techniques. If you have any small cardboard boxes or kitchen roll tubes that we could use please send them in with your child.

We enjoyed a fantastic sports day this week and hope you enjoy watching our videos on seesaw.

Hazel and Rowan News (Year 2)

We've had a great week in English! The children have learned all about 'How the Whale Got His Throat'. They've watched and listened to the story and even acted it out! We are so proud of all the children's written re-telling of the story. Ask your child if they can tell you (or even act out) the story of how the whale got his throat with you at home!

In maths, the children have been recapping their knowledge of time and measure. They've done lots of practical activities to practice their skills, and worked in teams to use clocks, scales, thermometers and rulers accurately.

We also enjoyed a fantastic sports day with Danny on Tuesday. A huge well done to all the children for participating in all the different races and working so well in their teams. It was great to see so many of them showing so much support and encouragement for each other. If you haven't already, log into Seesaw where you'll find a recorded version to watch!

We've continued to practice our end of Year 2 performance 'Pirates VS Mermaids'. The children have learned all the songs now, and we're very excited that we'll be filming it next week! Thank you to everyone who's sent in a costume so far, we think we're going to give Hollywood a run for their money!
