Little Acorns Pre-Nursery

The children have been hard at work playing and exploring this week in nursery. We have been learning how to sit on the carpet as we enjoy daily 'rhyme time' sessions. The children have really enjoyed choosing different items from the rhyme time basket and have been excellent at listening to the rhymes and joining in with the rhyme as well.

The children have been putting their hand muscles to the test this week by squeezing and squashing the playdough and moving colourful pom-poms into different containers using tweezers. These simple activities help build hand muscles needed to control pens and pencils when we learn to draw or write. Outside we have been practicing our number knowledge as we splash in the water tray with the ducks. Each duck has a number underneath, and the children were excited to see which number duck they had caught in their nets - of course the song '5 little ducks' has been sung lots of times whilst we play - we would love to hear if your child has been singing this to you at home too.

Acorn (Nursery am and pm)

Well done to the Nursery children for continuing to settle into Acorns Nursery so well. Over this week they have been enjoying circle games to get to know each other, as well as settling in to the Nursery routines. With our topic based around the theme 'Why do you love me so much?', they have been learning this week about their families and homes. It has been lovely to see some of the photos of the children's families this week and they have spoken to the class about them, please do bring them in next week if you haven't had a chance to yet. The children loved their first outdoor learning session, learning about Oak trees and acorns, and how to sit and move around safely in the log circles.

Next week we will be thinking about how we belong in school as well as in our families, and we will also be exploring the book 'Spot goes to school', as well as other stories about starting school. In Maths we will be practising copying and making repeating patterns using natural objects (e.g. acorn/pine cone/acorn/pine cone etc.), and other everyday objects such as buttons and bottle tops – maybe they can have a go at making some at home too? If you have any questions, do ask.

Maple and Beech class (Reception)

We would just like to say well done to all the Reception children for completing their first full week at school and what a busy week it has been!

In outdoor learning we explored our outside environment, practising how to get into a circle quickly when the teacher shouted 'sticky toes.' We also had a walk around the school looking at the pond area and wild garden.

We have been into Assembly twice this week in the hall sitting and listening to stories and practising some harvest singing.

Ms Duncan came and did some Music in our class on Tuesday afternoon, we made different sounds with our body.

In PE we played stuck in the mud and practised bouncing balls.

In Literacy we have listened to the story Halibut Jackson, which was about someone being shy and blending into the background, it had some wonderful illustrations that we talked about.

In Maths we have been matching pairs of objects and talking about how things are the same and different.

On top of that we have started going into smaller phonics groups, looking at letters s, a, t, p. Can you play eye spy and see if you can find things starting with these letters, or see if you can find examples of these letters written in the environment, on books or signs.

We used Sir Linkalot programme to help us learn the letter 'a' this week.

Birch and Cherry (Year 1)

In English this week we have been writing a simple story based on the book, 'Where's my Teddy?' We have been using colourful semantics to help us with our sentence structure. In Maths, we have been working on one more and one less and practicing our number formation. In Science, we have named and labelled our body parts played lots of games with actions. In Art, we have been mixing the primary colours to find out what happens.

Please could you help your child by reading at home every day. We understand that the children are tired when they come home so even reading a few pages is beneficial. At school, we aim to hear the children three times a week and will change books daily, if they have been finished.

Sir Linkalot words this week – do, go, no, so, do, ear, hear, near, eat, away.

Hazel and Rowan News (Year 2)

A huge well done to all the children on another fantastic week in Year 2! We've had another busy week. In maths, we have continued learning about place value, and have been reminding ourselves how to partition 2-digit numbers in different ways. See if your child can draw a part/whole model at home for you!

In English, we've learned how to use the suffix 'ed' to change verbs into the past tense (look – looked). We've also continued with our Castles topic, learning about the different jobs people did in castles. Ask your child if they can tell you what job they would have liked to do if they worked in a castle!

We've also been designing and creating this year's Christmas Cards for the PTA to sell. The children have been very creative, and we've used our knowledge of Paul Klee from our art lessons to inspire our drawings. We're very excited to see the finished product once they've all been printed!

Our Sir Linkalot words this week have been biscuit, country, couple and daughters. We've also been revisiting some of last week's words, to help us remember them.

We would love to welcome some adult helpers into school to read with the children or help us with our outdoor learning sessions. If you can spare any time to come in and help us, please let one of the adults know when collecting your child. We're also after materials for junk modelling, if you have any small boxes or cardboard rolls you can send our way!

We look forward to welcoming some of you to our Meet the Teacher meetings next week. If you have any questions or concerns about this year, please feel free to share them with us then. With thanks from the Year 2 team.
