School News

This week we have been celebrating Harvest and thinking about how we can help those in need. No one should have to hungry, and our local foodbank has reported a 33% increase in the number of emergency food parcels distributed by food banks in the Trussell Trust network compared to the previous year. We would like to extend our thanks to you all for your generosity in donations. We are very proud to be able to pass these onto the local foodbank for those most in need.

We would like to ask that ALL children bring their PE kit in a named bag on a Monday each week and that they leave it in school until Friday. On occasion it may be necessary for us to swap PE sessions between classes, and it is always handy for children to have a change of clothes in school should they get wet or dirty at break or lunch times.

We have had some queries from parents regarding the photographs from Tempest. We are expecting them very soon and once we receive them they will be handed to the children to put into their bags to bring home.

We have some lovely things planned leading up to the end of half term and at the start of the new half term for the children. On Tuesday 12th October we will have a visit from Sir Linkalot, and he will be completing spelling workshops with each year group (YR-Y2).

Sir Linkalot – The Future of Spelling

On Monday 18th October, Millets Falconry will be in school for the Year 2 children. Please can we ask parents to check that they have paid for this visit in advance. There is the option to part pay in instalments on Parentpay.

Halloween Disco

Finally on Thursday 21st October we will be holding our school Halloween Disco's! Little Acorns Pre-Nursery

Another very busy week in Little Acorns.

The children have been hard at work identifying numbers 1-10. We have been singing different number songs and have used our Numberblock friends to help us identify numbers by sight.

We have been challenging the children to see if they can squeeze under and crawl through our soft play equipment. Thinking about how we can move our bodies in different ways.

Outside the children have had the opportunity to get messy in our sensory tray. Some very keen to see what patterns they could produce using the various tools in the yoghurt paint.

Our builders yard construction site was a big hit this week. Lots of the children enjoyed using their tools to 'help fix things' around the garden. Some enjoyed building walls using the big blocks. It was lovely to see the children working together to achieve their goals.

Acorn (Nursery am and pm)

We have also been working hard practising putting our boots and shoes on this week, for Outdoor Learning.

This week the children have been enjoying making obstacle courses outside and describing their routes to their friends. We have been talking about what letter sound their names start with and decorating the 1st letter of their names. The children have been enjoying the story, 'Titch' this week and learning this week about how tall everyone in their families is and putting objects in order by size. Next week we will be learning about different shapes around us - maybe the children could go on a shape hunt around their house to look for things that are circles/squares/triangles/rectangles? With the weather becoming more Autumnal, please remember to bring a named coat everyday as we go outside in all weathers, and to wear outdoor clothes on a Wednesday when we have Outdoor Learning. If you have any questions, do ask Mrs Collis, Mrs Tanner or Miss Phillips.

Maple and Beech class (Reception)

In Reception this week, we have been really focusing on speaking and listening. We have been practising talking in full sentences and talking about things that are familiar and interesting to us. We have also played some speaking and memory games, for example "I went to the shop, and I bought...". We have continued to look at healthy eating, thinking about foods that would be healthy in our lunch boxes.

Our Sir Linkalot word this week was 'the'.

In maths we have been focusing on repeating patterns. We have made patterns with beads, with leaves, with conkers and stones, with sounds and body percussion, and with words in stories, listening to how the story of the Bear Hunt has lots of repeating word patterns.

We have talked about how we are the same as others and different from others. We made our own superheroes, deciding what our superpower would be. In computing we have been taking photographs of ourselves and things we find interesting in the Reception area. We have continued to develop our throwing and catching skills in outdoor PE and moving safely using gymnastics equipment in indoor PE.

In Outdoor Learning this week we planted the bulbs you all so kindly donated. We are looking forward to a riot of colour in the Spring. We also looked at how the Autumn leaves are changing colour (or not). We used sticks to find out the different sounds we could make tapping different surfaces in the playground.

As the weather gets colder, please can you make sure that your child has some tracksuit bottoms for outside PE.

Birch and Cherry (Year 1)

In Year 1 this week, we have been learning about and looking at toys from the past and present and have created a timeline to show when the toys were made. We will be using the timeline with all our topics this year to put the events in a chronological order.

We have continued to learn about addition in Maths and the different ways addition can be represented. In DT we made a chair for Baby Bear, we thought about different shapes and structures for our design and then used different joining techniques to make our chair. Thank you to everyone who sent in resources for us to use.

In outdoor learning next we will be making pinecone bird feeders. If you can send in some pinecones (particularly large ones) for us to use, we would be very grateful.

Hazel and Rowan News (Year 2)

It's been another great week in Year 2. In English this week, we've done lots of writing about dragons! The children have come up with some fantastic adjectives to describe dragons, and some have challenged themselves with expanded noun phrases and alliteration! Ask your child if they can remember some of our amazing dragon adjectives.

In maths, we've continued to work on fact families and the children have been able to demonstrate that they can use their knowledge of addition and subtraction to find missing numbers. We've also been looking at adding on 1 more, 1 less, 10 more and 10 less, and spotting what patterns we can see! In science this week, we've continued to think about bridges, and what makes them strong. The children have been using paper to make their own bridges and using different methods of folding and twisting to make their bridges strong. We've also continued to think about castles this week in history and have been sharing our knowledge with each other in group discussions and by creating our own castle fact files. The children are all experts on castles now!

This week's Sir Linkalot words were: system, theatre, through and tunnel.

Breakfast Bees and Bumblebees

Welcome back to all our Bumblebees and a big welcome to our new children that have joined us over the past few weeks!

We have been very lucky over the summer to have some new flooring and our breakfast bar moved, which has opened up the room and means that we can have more creative activities out.

This week in Bumblebees, and making use of the new space, we have been busy playing turn taking games. The children have been very good at sharing with their friends.

We have been making clay pumpkins ready for Halloween in a few weeks which we will soon be decorating.
