This term our topic is 'Why do Leaves go Crispy?'

This week we took advantage of the beautiful Autumn weather and the children enjoyed a walk to our forest school area. The children were excellent at holding on to the safety rope and remembered how to use their walking legs. Whilst in the forest area the children explored in the long grass hunting for different coloured leaves, climbed onto different sized log and some even felt brave enough to jump off, remembering how to land safely on two feet whilst bending our knees. Lots of fun was had as the children discovered the willow den! Some children began to sing independently as they made a 'fire' using sticks.

Back inside the nursery we talked about Bonfire night- what the children might see and hear and how to stay safe.

We enjoyed making edible chocolate sparklers for snack time too!

We enjoyed listening to some stories about Diwali, the festival of light. The children enjoyed Mendi hand colouring sheets in the mark making area.

The weather has turned colder so we please ask that your child has a coat, hat and gloves as we do still play outside every day.

Please do continue to bring in spare clothing (named) daily and a (named) water bottle.

Acorn Class (Nursery am and pm)

We are really proud of the way the Acorns children have come back to Nursery after the half term holiday, well done to all of them!

This term our topic will be 'Why Do Leaves Go Crispy?' and we will be learning about leaves and trees changing in Autumn, as well as learning about nocturnal animals.

The children have enjoyed the stories about fireworks and how to keep safe with fireworks this week. In outdoor learning we found different types of leaves, sticks and twigs to make tree pictures, and we made some leaf people and leaf families back in the classroom. After enjoying a fire in outdoor learning before half term, we have enjoyed having a pretend fire pit in our role play area this week.

We have been learning about the s/a/t/ letter sounds - see if your child can sing along to these phonics songs at home https://vimeo.com/76605648 We have been learning all about the number 1, and practising recognising small amounts of dots up to 3 without counting (subitising). We have also been practising counting carefully at times like register and snack time, counting how many children have got bananas/apples/oranges etc. We have also been learning a little about Remembrance Day and what the poppies are for.

Maple and Beech class (Reception)

In Reception this term our topic is all about celebrations. We have begun by learning about the Hindu and Sikh festivals of Diwali. We have read the story of Rama and Sita and used puppets to begin to act out the story. We have also made our own clay Diva pots.

In maths this week we have been looking at shapes, with a particular focus on circles and triangles. We have gone on a shape hunt and drawn and created pictures inspired by the shape pictures of Wassily Kandinsky. We have also looked at positional and directional language.

In Outdoor Learning we have continued developing our skills with hammers. We used nails this week, hammering them into clay.

Our Sir Linkalot words this week are: he, she, we, me.

This term in PE outdoors we are learning tag rugby. As the weather is getting significantly colder, please can you make sure the children have trainers, tracksuit bottoms and a jumper/hoodie for PE outside, as well as their T-shirt and shorts for indoor PE, which is dance this term.

Birch and Cherry (Year 1)

We have had a very exciting week in year 1! We had a visit from the Explorer Dome and went on a journey into space. We found out about the stars in the sky and the different shapes and pictures that they make. If we get a clear night, then maybe you could look at the sky and see if you can find any of these stars. We also saw our planet Earth, the moon and the sun. We learnt that Neil Armstrong was the first man to walk on the moon. We will be learning more about this in History. We will also be making our own moon buggies as part of our DT. If you could please start collecting cereal boxes or other small light cardboard boxes that we can use to make the chassis for our buggies we would be very grateful.

In English we have been writing recounts of either our half term holiday or the Explorer Dome experience.

In maths we have been learning about 2D and 3D shapes and their properties. Have a look around your home and see if you can find any of these shapes.

Hazel and Rowan News (Year 2)

What an exciting week we've had in Year 2 this week! On Tuesday, we had a visit from the Junk Man with his junk orchestra, and the children had great fun trying out lots of the junk instruments and having a boogie to his music! If your child has been inspired to make their own junk instrument at home, please ask them to bring it in to school to show us, we'd love to see! And don't forget, we will also be making junk instruments at school this term, so we'd very much still appreciate any donations of boxes, tubes, tubs or elastic bands which we can use to make our instruments.

In English, RE and PSHE this week, as well as part of their assembly, Year 2 have been learning about the importance of Remembrance Day, the significance of the poppy, and why we commemorate it each year. Do ask your child if they can explain to you why poppies are such a significant symbol of Remembrance Day today. They have also worked extremely hard to memorise their lines in the assembly, as well as the famous poem 'In Flander's Fields' by John McCrae.

In maths, both classes have been learning how to subtract two-digit numbers from twodigit numbers, by showing their workings out both on their own number line, and by recording the number sentences. They have also applied this by solving worded problems involving subtraction.

Also, this week Year 2 have learnt about the Gunpowder Plot and firework safety, and have created their own firework safety posters in art.

As our new topic this term is music-themed, in both ICT and music, the children have enjoyed listening to and comparing different kinds of music, as well as thinking about music generates emotions.


This week, they have now started learning to spell the words from the Sir Linkalot Christmas Carol bundle.
