#### **Little Acorns Pre-Nursery**

Last week, Christmas landed in Little Acorns Class!!!

The children were very excited to play and explore with the Festive themed activities this week. They enjoyed mark making in Christmas cards and writing letters to Father Christmas with pens and pencils. The children practised their fine motor abilities by using their hand muscles to pick up festive pom-poms using tweezers. They enjoyed the challenge of colour matching the pom-poms and counting how many they could collect. We transformed our reading area into a wonderful icy grotto where the children enjoyed looking through different books. The children have been able to listen to a range of Christmas songs and traditional Christmas carols over in the music corner- accompanied by the children's jingle bell playing too. They may be able to sing some of the songs and Carols we have learnt if you ask! In maths we counted different Christmas items- some children are able to count beyond 10, which is fantastic.

The children have enjoyed our sensory tray reindeer food activity, as well as mark making in 'snow and glitter' using their pointer fingers to create different shapes and patterns. Some children are beginning to recognise their initial letter for their name, which if fabulous. In the maths area, we sorted different sized Christmas objects into big, medium, and small. Outside the children explored making 'Christmas soup' in the water tray and worked as busy elves in the Elf toy workshop.

We had a wonderful time at out Christmas party, singing Christmas songs and dancing to Christmas music whilst wearing our Christmas crowns- which the children enjoyed making.

It's been a positive term, with lots of our children becoming independent seeing to their personal hygiene needs- keep up the good work over the holidays everyone and we look forward to seeing you all and welcoming new friends in January. A very merry Christmas to you all – from the Little Acorns team.

#### Acorns (Nursery am and pm)

We have enjoyed learning about the Christian Nativity story and how Jesus was born at Christmas. We have been doing lots of Christmas crafts! We have also been practising some Christmas songs and rhymes, and in our roleplay area we have a Santa's Grotto where the children have been practising wrapping presents, talking about how big/small/long/short the presents are, and how much wrapping paper we need.

We have also enjoyed our yummy Christmas lunch and played games at our party!

## Maple and Beech class (Reception)

Last week in Literacy, we wrote to Father Christmas! We talked about where we lived and some children could tell us their house number. In Maths we talked about time, learnt about the four seasons and what we wear at different times of the year. We then started to make calendars. We were very impressed with how the children have learnt their lines and song words. We have continued to explore outside using our advent calendar.

Wow what a week we have had this week! On Monday we had a very busy day, dress rehearsals, a fly- by with Santa and his Elf in a chinook and Popcorn and hot chocolate in Outdoor learning. The children did very well recording their nativity scenes. We enjoyed a very delicious Christmas dinner and had fun with party games on Wednesday. We would like to wish you and your family a very merry Christmas and we will see you all in the New Year. Our topic after the holidays is, 'Once Upon a Time...'

## Birch and Cherry (Year 1)

Last week, we were busy remembering what we have learnt this Term and what we can do independently. We wrote our own versions of the 'Beegu' story and tried our best to answer a variety of maths questions, including additions and subtractions. To conclude our learning about materials in science we investigated 'What Keeps Us Dry?'. We wrapped cuddly toys up in a selection of materials and poured water on them to explore which materials were 'waterproof'. In geography, we learned the names of the oceans of the world - see if your child can remember any of their names.

This week we have learnt that Christmas is a Christian festival and we discussed what presents we would give Jesus if he was born today. We had some interesting ideas! A Ferrari, gold toy, lots of money to name a few. The children have enjoyed making cards, calendars and party hats. We hope that you all have a safe and enjoyable holiday.

We recorded our Christmas Play and would like to thank you for providing all the lovely costumes.

## Hazel and Rowan News (Year 2)

In writing last week, Year 2 really enjoyed continuing work based on The Snowman story, including lots of descriptive work using expanded noun phrases (do ask your child to explain what these are, and can they give you an example!), sequencing using pictures and story maps. The children have all worked exceptionally hard on writing their own version of the whole story and have proudly shared their work with each other. In maths, both classes have continued work on multiplication, learning more about how to derive the repeated addition and multiplication number sentences from arrays, as well as deriving the times tables facts for the 2, 5, and 10 times tables (some have even worked out the facts for the 3x table). In particular, the children now need to practise learning the facts for the 2, 5 and 10 times tables so that they know them by heart. In Science the children have enjoyed investigating whether water can make music using fair testing, and have recorded their findings. In ICT, they have continued learning to use the Chrome music program 'Music Lab Song Maker' to begin creating their own rhythms and tunes.

It's been a very exciting week in school this week! On Monday we had a very special guest fly over the school to give all the children a wave - we think he must be very impressed with how good all the children have been this year to make an appearance so close to Christmas! We've also filmed our Christmas play this week, and hope you all enjoy watching it. The children have all worked so hard this month to learn their lines and the words to the songs. We've also all also enjoyed a festive Christmas lunch together and had our Christmas party! In between all the celebrations, we've been busy making Christmas hats, cards and place-mats.

We've continued now finished working through the Christmas Carroll bundle with Sir Linkalot, and completed our end-of-term spelling quiz.

Thank you for all the support from home this term, and a huge thank you for all the lovely well wishes, cards and presents. The Year 2 team wish you all a very happy and restful Christmas, and we can't wait to see all the children back in 2022!
