Little Acorns Pre-Nursery

This week in Little Acorns we have been celebrating Chinese New Year with lots of exciting activities.

We have been reading 'Peppa Pig's Chinese New Year'- to help us learn more about this celebration. The children were very excited to learn a song 'Kung Hei Fat Choy' - maybe they could sing it for over the weekend? We looked at photographs showing lots of festival celebrations too. The children liked all the bright colourful dragons and proudly displayed their knowledge of colour able to identify colours they could see. As a class the children painted paper plates and combined the plates made a body for our own class dragon.

The room was decorated in the lucky colours of red and gold. In the mark making area the children tried hard to draw Chinese symbols in red and gold glitter with their pointer finger.

We enjoyed sorting red, yellow and orange pom-poms into gold containers using tweezers- this helps the children to build and strengthen their hand muscles.

Outside the children enjoyed the sensory tray filled this week with red rice- gold and silver pots and Chinese money wallets- the children were able to demonstrate their skills of focus and concentration as the carefully scooped and poured rice into the different containers.

Acorns (Nursery am and pm)

Well done to Acorns for learning so much about Chinese New Year this week! We have enjoyed learning about how Chinese New Year is celebrated, and we have tried some different Chinese foods, as well as learning how letters and numbers in Chinese are written very differently.

We have loved role playing in our 'Chinese restaurant', and have enjoyed being chefs and waiters, serving noodles and rice! We have been enjoyed making Chinese dragons and lanterns in the art area, and have danced to Chinese music.

Next week, we will be reading 'The Very Hungry Caterpillar' by Eric Carle. On Wednesdays for Outdoor Learning, please can your child wear shoes or boots that are easy for them to take on and off to aid the children's independence when they are changing into their outdoor shoes.

Maple and Beech class (Reception)

In Reception this week we have had a lot of children off for various reasons so we have joined the classes. The children have been amazing whichever classroom they have used each day, at sharing and taking turns with different people.

This week we have been learning about Chinese New Year. We have watched clips of people celebrating Chinese New Year, learnt a Chinese dragon song, and made lots of Chinese art works. We made our own spring rolls and in literacy we have changed the story of the Gingerbread man to be the Spring Roll man. We also tried prawn crackers, noodles, rice, lychees and physalis fruits.

In maths we have been learning about the numbers 6, 7 and 8. We have explored which smaller numbers can be combined to make 6,7 or 8. This is the beginning of us learning our number bonds.

We have spent a lot of time this week practising for our class assembly all about Chinese New Year. We will record this on Friday and post it on Seesaw so parents can see what we have been doing. It's been a really fun week!

Birch and Cherry (Year 1)

We have really enjoyed learning all about Chinese New Year this week.

In English we have learnt the story of The Great Race and have written a version of it, making it into a book with a front cover too!

In maths, we have used the story to learn about ordinal numbers. In outdoor learning we made clay models of dragons and decorated them with stones, twigs and leaves to make them look scary.

We have also learnt how to do a Chinese hand dance, which we loved!

Hazel and Rowan News (Year 2)

What a lovely week we've had in Year 2! We've had lots of fun learning more about Chinese New Year, and doing some fantastic arts and crafts to link with this topic! In English, we've read the story of The Magic Paintbrush, and had a go at re-writing it. The children have used some fantastic vocabulary, and are becoming experts in including adjectives and expanded noun phrases to make their writing even better. See if your child can retell the story to you at home.

In maths, we've done some Chinese New Year themed activities, including missing number activities and code breaking! We even used our fantastic maths skills to solve a crime! We've also done lots of art activities this week. We were very excited to work with Mrs Nisbet on Monday doing some Chinese themed arts and crafts. We've also painted a dragon mask and decorated sheets, which we used to do our very own dragon dance at the end of the week! In ICT, we used I pads to research the Chinese Zodiac Story; ask your child if they can tell you what animal represents 2022. We even got to try some Chinese food, and had a go at using chopsticks!

We've continued to work though the Great Grimms bundle with Sir Linkalot. Just a gentle reminder too, we'd still welcome any donations of leaflets, packaging, magazines or newspapers for our Karl Schwitters based art lessons over the coming week.
