Little Acorns Pre-Nursery

A week of love in Little Acorns! We have fully embraced Valentine's Day and the children have enjoyed making cards for someone special using their painting skills. The children have independently drawn on heart shaped pieces of paper using different colour felt tip pens- allowing their fine motor and focusing skills to develop.

During our weekly Friday yoga session we all took a moment of thoughtfulness to pause and think about how we were feeling. Some children were able to expression their emotions such as "happy" whilst others could show their emotions with a smile.

During the week the children have been able to explore how different emotions might look by putting together different facial features with our emotion blocks.

In maths we talked about positional language, and we challenged the children to place different items- 'on top of' 'next to' 'under' or 'inside'.

The children enjoyed exploring in the 'The dinosaur that pooped a Rainbow' activity tray. Some children were able to sort the dinosaurs in big, medium, and small independently which is brilliant.

We read the story 'Brown Bear, Brown Bear'- the children were fascinated to discover what the brown bear could see. We went on our own walk into the big school playground to discover what we could see! Walking independently is a really important skill. The children are taught to walk at a safe speed whilst holding onto the safety rope as a group. Maybe this weekend you can practise holding your child's hand whilst going for a little walk.

Acorns (Nursery am and pm)

Well done to Acorns for learning so much about The Very Hungry Caterpillar and how he changed this week! We have enjoyed learning about the changes in the life cycle of a caterpillar, and how they change. We have talked about and sorted healthy and not so healthy foods. We have loved role playing in our 'Cafe', and have enjoyed weighing food to cook, being chefs and serving food to the customers! We have enjoyed making caterpillars and butterflies in the art area.

Next week, we will be reading 'The Rainbow Fish' and Elmer stories thinking about the different colours they are.

On Wednesdays for Outdoor Learning, please can your child wear shoes or boots that are easy for them to take on and off to aid the children's independence when they are changing into their wellie boots.

Maple and Beech class (Reception)

In Reception this week we have been reading and learning the story of, 'The Three Billy Goats Gruff'. We retold the story with puppets; we made trolls and tried to write sentences about them.

In maths, we have been playing games with one more and one less. We have also been playing memory games and spotting 6, 7 and 8 in different ways.

In outdoor learning we worked on our team skills trying to cross a 'river' with hoops. We also worked together to make bridges using crates and planks.

We have read different stories about feelings each day as part of children's Mental Health Week.

A reminder our walk in the local area is next Wednesday, please make sure children are in shoes suitable for walking and have a coat.

Birch and Cherry (Year 1)

This week in Year One we have read and started to learn the story of 'Handa's Surprise'. See if your child can recall the main characters, the African animals and fruits in the story. Some of us have made our own story maps and some of us have answered comprehension questions about the story. We all enjoyed sampling some of the delicious fruits in our snack time.

In maths, we have been consolidating our knowledge of number bonds to 10/20 using counters and 'tens frames' and 'numicon' to help us. We have then used our knowledge of number bonds to record addition sentences. We have also learnt that we can partition numbers (split them into two smaller numbers) to make addition easier. (for example to work out 8+5, we can split the 5 into 2+3, then do 8+2 first in our head (since we know this makes 10) then add on the 3)

In D.T. we have used the skills built up over the last few weeks to design our own moving 'fairytale' pictures. We were able to choose our own mechanisms, 'levers', 'sliders' or 'pivots' or a combination of any of these. See if your child can explain how they intend for their pictures to move. Perhaps also see if they can tell you the directions on a compass, because we all made our own pretend compasses and used these to follow directions in the playground.

Hazel and Rowan News (Year 2)

This week in year 2, we've been very busy as always!

In English, we've been reading the book, 'Journey', by Aaron Becker. As it's just a picture book, the children have had to come up with their own ideas and vocabulary to re-write the story. They've done a super job, and have even thought about the different emotions which the main character experiences as the story progresses.



In maths, we're back to looking at 2D and 3D shapes. The children have been counting sides, faces and vertices, plus using shapes to make repeating patterns. Ask your child how many 2D and 3D shape names they can remember, and whether they can describe them to you using mathematical language.

We've done lots of ICT too this week, using Ipads to take photographs. The children have been thinking about what makes a good photograph and having a go at using a frame to take their own pictures.

We've continued to work though the Great Grimms bundle with Sir Linkalot.

And finally, some exciting news for after half term - Ms Duncan will be starting a choir after school on a Tuesday! The first session will be a taster session, so children can try it out just to see if it's for them. Who knows, we might discover the next Ariana Grande or Justin Bieber!! More details to follow...
