Ben Ash, Laura Hooke, Sian Killen, Charmaine Kelly We've all had an egg-cellent week in Little Acorns. Following on from our group time last week the children had asked if we can eat eggs, so they were very excited to help make scrambled egg for their snack time! Each child had a turn at whisking the egg.

They enjoyed sampling their scrambled egg with buttered toast- how yummy! The children were able to independently scoop up the egg and feed themselves! Brilliant.

In maths this week we have been busy at number recognition from numbers 1-10 with the help of numberblocks! We even built our own numberblocks using small, coloured cubes.

Our story of the week was 'Freddy the Frog' and 'Lizzie the lamb' two short rhyming stories.

Outside the weather has been kind and the children have been able to enjoy the grass area, this has allowed lots of turn taking and sharing of the cars and bikes.

Lots enjoyed our sensory farmyard tray whilst others enjoyed splashing with the ducks and frogs in the water tray. It's been lovely to hear the children making farm animal noises whilst playing!

Acorn (Nursery am and pm)

This week after all the fun of Book Week last week, we have properly started with our 'Are Eggs Alive?' topic and have talked what we know already about how eggs hatch, and we have started learning about the life cycle of an egg, what hatches out of an egg and what eggs are used for. We have been drawing life cycles of a chicken and thinking about the stages of life. We have been thinking about how plants grow too and we have planted some cress seeds! See if your child can tell you what conditions they need to grow!

Next week we will be learning about other farm animals through the Farmer Duck story and retelling the story with small world animals. We will be revising the s/a/t/p/i/n/m/d/g/o/c/k/e/u/r/h/f/b/l letter sounds and practising blending these sounds together to read words - see if your child can sing the Jolly Phonics songs to you <u>https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=hIQ5L9xgU4g</u>. We will also be

making repeating patterns with natural objects, e.g. leaf/stick/leaf/stick.

Maple and Beech class (Reception)

We started the week with a poem workshop with Ian Bland, where we created our own action poem, which we then performed at the end of the day.

This week we went on a spring walk around the school, it was lovely to see all of the bulbs we planted in Autumn starting to come out. Can you see if you can spot any new flowers or buds on the trees near your house? Maybe you could take a photo and upload it to seesaw so we can have a look together.

In Literacy this week we have been learning the story of 'Jack and the Beanstalk', we have acted it out and imagined what we might see if we climbed a beanstalk, which then helped us write some simple sentences.

In maths we have been counting backwards from 10, comparing amounts of objects using the words 'more' 'less/fewer' and have started to think about pairs that make 10.

Don't forget we are going to the farm on Wednesday – Please make sure your child has trainers and track suit trousers on, a bag for their wellies (If their wellies are in school) and a suitable coat. Lunch bag is provided unless you have stated that you will be providing your own. We are all really looking forward to it!

Birch and Cherry (Year 1)

Wow, what a start to the week having the Poet Ian Bland come in. The Year One children loved creating their own poem with him, he made us all laugh including the teachers. In English this week we are learning all about Sir David Attenborough and what he has done to raise awareness about wildlife and the planet. Ask the children what facts they can remember about him. We are beginning to record our own wildlife reports using the iPad. During Maths this week we have continued to learn about measure and length and height. We have used metre sticks and rulers to help us measure correctly.

In RE we have started to learn about what it was like when Jesus entered Jerusalem and how he was treated as a special person. The children said that if they were to welcome Jesus to Burghfield they would make him cookies and cups of coffee and give him flowers and wave hello.

We have continued learning about animals and labelling the different body parts and saying which animal group they belongs to.

During outdoor learning we have been exploring the Year 2 wildlife area and ponds on the hunt for minibeasts. Can you think of any that we might find?

We are also going to start planting some vegetables in the raised beds outside the kitchen areas. If anyone has any seeded potatoes, bean, pea, carrot or salad seeds they would like to donate we would be very grateful.

Hazel and Rowan News (Year 2)

It has been an exciting week for Year 2. On Monday we were lucky to enough to spend some time with a poet – Ian Bland. We enjoyed a fantastic poetry workshop with him where we wrote our very own Animal Alliteration poem - You can see the fantastic performances of our poems on Seesaw!

In our English lessons we have started a new topic, studying the book 'Into the Forest' by Anthony Browne. We started the week by making predictions about the book and comparing it to similar stories. Now we are moving towards planning and writing our own stories based on this text. Ask your child if they can remember the events from the story.

In maths we are nearing the end of our fractions unit. This week we have learnt the difference between unit and non-unit fractions, explored equivalent fractions and begun to look at counting in fractions from 0 to 1 whole.

In science we have planned and begun an investigation to explore which conditions are best for plants to grow in. Each week we will observe our plants to see which ones have grown and which ones haven't. We can't wait to watch our plants grow throughout the term!

We are now working our way through the Blue Blyton bundle with Sir Linkalot.
