Little Acorns Pre-Nursery

Spring has sprung in Little Acorns this week.

During carpet time we have been learning about Spring and changes that Springtime can bring. We have been looking at our outdoor areas to see if we can notice any changes, some children were able to notice the falling blossom, flowers growing in our grass and the warmer air outside.

Our story of the week was 'My Mum' to celebrate Mother's Day this coming Sunday. We talked about what we liked about our Mummies and why. The children have worked very hard to make their Mummies something very special.

In our roll play area the children enjoyed taking care of their babies. The children took their babies for a walk in the garden and then put them to sleep by reading stories and singing them nursery rhymes.

In Maths this week have been trying to use description language such as Bigger, biggest, smaller and smallest to sort farm animals. Outside the children have been able to enjoy the grass area and using the balance beam to walk across – making mud pies in the mud kitchen and discovering what items roll down the guttering best!

Acorn (Nursery am and pm)

Well done to all the children in Nursery who have been playing so well with their friends this week! This week we have enjoyed making obstacle courses in Outdoor Learning, and looking for signs of Spring by the pond.

In our 'Are Eggs Alive?' topic we have enjoyed the 'Rosie's Walk' story and enjoyed predicting what would happen next with the fox following Rosie! We have practised sequencing and retelling the story in groups, and the children have used some lovely story language!

Next week we will be thinking about what we have learned about eggs and reading the book 'Rabbits Don't Lay Eggs', thinking about animals that do/don't lay eggs. We will also be exploring how we celebrate Easter. In phonics we will practising blending these sounds together to read words. We will also plan to enjoy some Easter crafts!

Please can you make sure all their uniform, coats and water bottles are named as it makes it much easier to find missing items! Thank you.

Maple and Beech News (Reception)

In Reception this week we have continued reading the story, 'The Enormous Turnip', changing it from a turnip to an enormous potato. Maple class finished their story with all the characters eating a jacket potato with cheese and beans, their favourite lunch!

In maths, we have been working on our understanding of subitising (recognising small numbers of objects without counting) and number bonds to 5 and 10. We have been reading Beatrix Potter stories and thinking about how long ago Beatrix Potter lived. In computing and geography, we used the Ipads to take photographs of features outside to add to a map of our playground.

We are really enjoying using tools in outdoor learning. We are hoping to make our own fences for our wild areas and for this we need lots of willow or hazel poles. We plan to saw and whittle small pieces as stakes, then weave branches through them. If you are doing any spring gardening and cutting hazel or willow we would be very grateful for any donations.

Reception have a new woodwork area, kindly built for us by Mr. Ash, and we are looking for donations to stock it. If you have any off-cuts of soft woods - balsa, pine, we would love them to practice sawing, drilling and screwing into. We also need 25mm round nails and no 10. 3/4 inch screws.

And finally embellishments - old cds, bottle tops (plastic and metal), beads.

As the weather gets warmer please can you make sure children have their PE shorts and t-shirt with them in school. Also a reminder that for outdoor learning they should be wearing a long sleeved top and long trousers regardless of the weather, as we play in grass that gets very long (this becomes a risk for tics in the summer months as plenty of wildlife wander through the outside areas at night). Please can we also ask that if you listen to your child read at home, that you record this in their diary. Initialling the day will do.

Birch and Cherry (Year 1)

This week in maths we have learning about money. We have looked at the different coins- at their size, shape and colour and we have been practising counting small amounts of coins. This has been an uphill struggle for many, especially as in recent times, we find ourselves having less a less coins in the house. If you are able to, it would be a great idea to raid those piggybanks and have another looking at coins, seeing what their values are, and trying to find the value of a small number of coins.

In English, we have been writing non- chronological reports about badgers. We have put this together in a leaflet and have included a heading and sub-headings too. We have now started planning our own leaflet about an animal of our choice and have used non-fiction books and the Internet to find out more information about them.

We have been soaking up the sun this week and in Outdoor Learning we made habitats for an animal. We had to make sure the habitat suited the animal, for example a penguin needs somewhere cold to live. This linked well with our Science, where we have been thinking about the different animal groups (mammals, invertebrates, amphibians, reptiles, fish, birds) and the similarities and differences between them.

Hazel and Rowan (Year 2)

Year 2 have been busy this week getting started with our new writing topic – non chronological reports. We started off the week by exploring existing reports and understanding their different features. Next, we researched some facts about common flowers and began creating our own reports about them. Ask your child if they can recall a fact about their chosen flower!

In maths, we have started learning a new topic – measure. We have been estimating lengths, using rulers to measure the length of objects within the class and comparing and ordering lengths up to one meter. Next week we will start looking at much larger lengths, measuring in meters.

In the afternoons we have been enjoying the sunshine as much as possible, getting outside for our geography and outdoor learning where we have been learning to use maps. We have followed maps to find specific locations in a 'treasure' hunt and begun to make maps of our outdoor learning area to use in further activities next week. In science we have dissected kidney beans to find out about how a plant starts its life. We discovered that seeds start their life with a food store.


We are still hoping to receive some donations of seeds we can grow in our raised bed, if you have any you feel you would be able to donate, it would be greatly appreciated.
