Little Acorns Pre-Nursery

This week in Little Acorns the children have been brave and enjoyed the challenge of completing the obstacle course outside. We have learnt to wait for our turn and talked about how to travel safely across the equipment.

Also outside this week, the children enjoyed working in small groups in the nature garden. A big thank you to all our lovely parents who donated plants, seeds and soil. The children have enjoyed potting seeds, weeding the flower beds and getting the area ready for planting next week. We have continued to practise our fine motor skills and the children have made excellent progress using our safety scissors, some were able to independently make snips along the dotted line on the paper!

The children have demonstrated excellent focus this week whilst practising their mark-making skills. We have been thinking about how and where we hold the pen.

During our daily carpet time, we have been chatting about big nursery, the children have learnt how to sit with their legs crossed and how we can use our looking eyes, listening ears and quiet lips. Maybe this weekend you could ask your child to show you how well they can sit and listen now.

Acorn (Nursery am and pm)

This week in Acorns the children have been reading the story 'Superworm'. We have made our own minibeasts from clay and have painted them ready to display!

The children have also been looking at pictures of minibeasts in detail and trying to paint some of our own.

In maths, we have been talking about length and measuring. We have used language of long, short, longer and shorter.

In Science this week we were experimenting with materials to find the strongest material that would make a good snail home.

We have been trying very hard this week to look after all the spiders we find in our nursery garden. The children are very careful when trying to pick them up and are very good bug detectives using magnifying glasses to find them!

Maple and Beech News (Reception)

In Reception this week we have continued learning about journeys. This week we read books about Antarctic exploration and Antarctic animals. We imagined being Ernest Shackleton on his dangerous adventure to get to the South Pole. We role-played exploring in our classrooms, with our backpacks and binoculars searching for animals that live in cold climates. We wrote sentences and labels for pictures from the Antarctic.

In maths we have been exploring the properties of shapes. We made tangram pictures and challenged ourselves to find the right shapes to fit.

Our bus trip yesterday was a great success and the weather was on our side! We really enjoyed going on the bus and getting to sit on the miniature trains. The children behaved really well and were a credit to Mrs. Bland's School. Thank you so much to our parent helpers who made it possible.

Birch and Cherry (Year 1)

This week in Year One, we have been continuing to learn about the life of Mary Anning - the pioneering fossil collector and Paleontologist. We recited sentences about her life and then used word mats and sound mats to write independently. See if your child can remember any of the key events in her life.

In Geography, we learnt that the world and continents looked different in the age of the dinosaurs. They were grouped together as a supercontinent called Pangea. We then learnt whereabouts in the world some of the dinosaur fossils were found.

In maths, we have been learning to divide / share numbers into equal groups. We have enjoyed working in pairs and showing this practically with counters.

The children really enjoyed our D.T. lesson this week, where we were testing the best way to join two pieces of fabric. The children explored using glue, masking tape, safety pins and sewing. They will be using their sewing skills next week when they start to make dinosaur hand puppets. So far, they have designed their puppets and created a list of materials they will need to make them.

Hazel and Rowan (Year 2)

What a fantastic week year 2 have had!

This week we were lucky enough to spend a day at Thatcham Discovery Centre, enhancing our science knowledge. The children engaged in activities such as pond dipping and mini-beast hunting! We were so impressed with the amazing behaviour of the children – and how brave they were in the face of all those creepy crawlies!

The children have also been busy in maths reflecting on the learning they have found tricky this year and revising some of those areas. Some children spent time practising addition and subtraction, some recapped money and some pushed themselves to apply their learning to complex word problems. Each and every child has worked extremely hard and we are so proud of their efforts.

Finally, a big thank you to those children who performed at the May Fayre last Sunday. It was fantastic to see so many of you there, we are very grateful for the support. The children danced beautifully!
