Maple and Beech News (Reception)

Well done to all the children in Reception. They have done amazingly well in their first week and enjoyed exploring throughout the classrooms and outside.

Please can you make sure ALL clothes, lunchboxes, shoes etc. are named as we already have a couple of jumpers we are trying to match to their children.

Also please do not put any food in the children's bags as there are children within school with severe allergies to a variety of different allergens. School provide children with a snack daily.

We look forward to our first full week next week, details of days for outdoor learning and PE will be sent separately.

Birch and Cherry (Year 1)

Well done to all the children for a fantastic first week in Year 1. We have been really impressed with how well they have settled into the new routines. The children have been introduced to our topic of 'Toys'. Our role-play for this term is a 'toy museum' and we are learning all about the history of toys and how the type and material of toys has changed over time. To support our topic, we would be grateful for any examples of **old toys** for 'show and tell'. If you're happy for them to stay in school to be handled by children please let us know, if not the children can bring them straight back home after showing to the class.

As part of our topic we will also be visiting Milestones Museum on Tuesday 27th September. More details will follow shortly, but in the meantime, if you are able to help on this trip, please can you let us know.

In maths this week we have been learning to sort objects by colour, size and shape. We have practised our careful counting and used numberlines to record the numbers in writing. We have also introduced how to count along a hundred square and we have made our own personal hundred squares with the odd and even numbers in alternate colours.

In English lessons we have focused on the alphabet - finding missing letters, saying letter names and matching lowercase to uppercase letters. We have also had guidance to use the role play toy museum and work on our speaking and listening skills. The staff have been busy sorting reading books for all the children, taking in to account any progression or repetition needed from over the summer so reading books will be sent home consistently next week (if you haven't already seen them!).

If you have any questions, please do come and speak to any of us at the end of the day, or leave a message with a staff member on the gate in the morning. We look forward to working with you this year.

Hazel and Rowan (Year 2)

Wow! What a fantastic first week back at school for year 2! The children have been absolutely brilliant this week and despite being very tired, they have worked extremely hard.

In maths we have started our unit on place value. We have been revisiting some of the learning from year 1, completing missing number sequences and beginning to partition larger numbers into tens and ones. Next week we will be ordering and comparing numbers.

In writing we have been making links to our history topic and learning all about castles. We started off by labelling some key parts of castles and considering how and why they were used. We then started learning about the roles of knights. We will continue this learning next week as we write about 'how to become a knight!'


Our afternoons have been filled with computing, science, geography and art which the children have loved! We are looking forward to continuing this work next week.
