# **School News**

This week we welcomed parents back into school in our 'Meet the Teacher' events. These meetings are a chance to hear some of the ways we teach your children and some of the things they will learn this year in an informal manner. It also gives parents a chance to see the classroom in which their children are based. Thank you to all those that could attend and for those that couldn't the presentations from the evening will be uploaded to the school website next Monday.

You should all now have received your child's school photograph proofs. If you have not received them yet, please speak to your child's class teacher. Next week two educational visits are taking place. Year 1 will visit Milestones Museum in Basingstoke as part of their 'Toys' topic on Tuesday and on Wednesday Year 2 will visit Oxford Castle as part of their 'Towers, Tunnels and Turrets topic.' These trips prove to be incredibly beneficial to the children's learning and all of the children come back buzzing with the new information they have learned. We have now secured the required number of parent/carer helpers for both trips – thank you so much!

We also have the school nurses in with us next week for the flu immunisations. They will be in on **Wednesday** morning to give the immunisations to Reception and Year 1. ## **Little Acorns Pre-Nursery**

This week in Little Acorns, the children have really settled into their nursery routine. The children have been practising using their 'listening ears' when they hear the tambourine.

During carpet time this week, the children enjoyed the 'Tap, tap box'. This is a fun game where we tap out a child's name, and they get to look inside the box to find a nursery rhyme of their choice. This game helps us practise our speech and language skills and our turn-taking abilities. We have begun learning some actions during our singing. This helps little ones develop their communication skills as well.

The children enjoyed a trip to the hall where we sang some jumping songs. It's a perfect place to develop our independent jumping using both feet at once. The children were very good at holding onto the safety rope whilst we moved from the nursery to the hall. If out and about this weekend, we would like to ask parents to continue to encourage their child to walk independently whilst holding onto an adult's hand. These are excellent safety skills to reinforce to children.

# Acorns (Nursery am and pm)

This week in Acorns we have started our topic of 'Why do you love me so much?' The children discussed who they love and who loves them. We talked about ways to make each other happy. In Maths we have been singing number songs and counting up to 10, as well as looking at simple patterns.

In Science we learnt how important soap is when we wash our hands!

Please take a look at seesaw to see your child's learning throughout the week.

Please be aware that we give the children cups of milk/water at snack time and encourage them to drink their water bottles throughout the session.

# Maple and Beech News (Reception)

This week in Reception we have started our new phonics scheme. The children have learnt the sounds for 4 letters – s a t p. We have put a game and link on seesaw for ideas to support this.

In English we were talking about our feelings and what we look like using the books 'Be who you are' and the 'Mega magic hair swap'. We have been practising our letter formation and writing our names.

In maths we have been subitising, looking for small amounts without counting. We have done this inside with small objects and outside during outdoor learning.

We have started to use our woodworking area, practising hammering nails into wood. If you have any off cuts of very soft wood we would appreciate any donations. In outdoor learning we explored what we could use sticks for – they were swords, walking sticks, fishing rods and pets.

# **Birch and Cherry (Year 1)**

The children have worked very hard in Year 1 this week. They have been getting to grips with our new phonic games and activities. Our focus digraphs (two letters making one sound) have been: **ay, ea, ie, aw and ue**. See if your child can recognise these sounds and read some words containing the digraphs.

For maths this week we have used number lines and counting objects to 'count back' and answer 'one less' questions. We have also used our number knowledge to fill in missing numbers on number tracks.

In outdoor learning we have continued to talk about different trees and leaves and the changes that occur in Autumn. We gathered leaves and acorns to create natural pictures on the ground. It was lovely to see the children's imaginations and enjoyment of this process. There was lots of good team work too.

We look forward to our trip to Milestones museum next Tuesday to enhance our learning about the history of toys. Please ensure that your child wears the usual uniform and they will only need a **small** rucksack or named carrier bag in which to bring their lunch and water bottle. Since we will be indoors for the trip, there is no need for any extra water proofs - maybe just a light jacket to get to and from the coach if there is rain forecast. Your child will also not need to bring in their bookbag for the trip.

However, on other days please can you make sure they bring in bookbags / reading books regardless of whether or not they have finished reading that particular book. Also, please do use the reading diaries to record any reading you have done at home so that we can see when their book needs changing.

# Hazel and Rowan (Year 2)

This week year 2 have been busy continuing our topic on 'Towers and Turrets'. In English we have looked at the differences between fiction and non-fiction texts and begun writing our own information text about life inside a castle. The children have learnt some amazing (and some disgusting!) facts about castles - ask them if they can remember any!

In maths we have continued our work on number and place value. This week we have been using number lines to count in 10s and identifying missing numbers in the sequence. We have also started to think about what number might be halfway between two given numbers.


In science, we conducted our first investigation of the year! We wanted to find out which material was the strongest, so we put 4 different types of paper to the test. The children tied a bag to each piece of paper and gradually filled the bag with weights to see which paper could hold the heaviest weight. Spoiler alert! The card and sugar paper were clear winners.

Next week, we will be going on our trip to Oxford Castle and we are very excited! Thank you to all the parents who volunteered to support us, we now have enough helpers. Enjoy your weekend:)
