Halloween Disco18th October

This week in Little Acorns, the children have been working hard on their sharing skills. The children have enjoyed working with their friends using the foam blocks to build large towers, tunnels to crawl through, and houses to jump up and down in!

You may have noticed the odd spec of glitter arriving home with your child after their session - this was due to the glitter trays in the markmaking area. We used our pointer fingers to draw shapes and patterns in the glittering trays!

During our carpet time this week, we used a wide range of musical instruments as we played and sang our favourite nursery rhymes.

The children were very focused as they learnt how to use tweezers to move coloured pom-poms into different containers. This activity helps develop their hand-eye coordination as well as their hand muscles, which are needed for pencil control.

Acorns (Nursery am and pm)

This week in Acorns the children have been looking at the story of Titch.

We have been using the language 'big', 'little', 'small', 'large'. We have been putting objects in order of size and even tried to put ourselves in height order.

We have also learned about the life of Rosa Parks who was at the forefront of a civil rights movement in America to allow people of colour to sit anywhere on a bus and the children were in awe of how much life has changed since then.

In PE the children have been enjoying going outside with our Sports Coach Danny and have been practising our throwing skills. Some children showed great confidence in aiming for the furthest hoop!

In science we made biscuits of different sizes to link in with our maths of size. We discussed how we wash our hands before cooking to keep the germs away.

Maple and Beech News (Reception)

This week in Reception we have had a phonics spot check week. We spent the week revising the sounds we have already learnt – s a t p i n m g d o and have been trying to blend them together to read simple CVC words (consonant, vowel, consonant). We have continued to practise writing simple words and making them with magnetic letters. We have started guided reading, where once a week the children read the same book together in a group to encourage book talk. You will receive some information separately about reading books beginning to come home with the children from next week.

In maths we have been focusing on repeating patterns. We have made patterns inside with Duplo and beads and outside with natural objects. We finished the week by making our own healthy fruit kebabs, adding the fruit in repeating patterns.

Please can the children bring in a photo of their family next week, you can email a photo to <u>reception@mrsblands.w-berks.sch.uk</u> if you don't have a printed out photo. In the next couple of weeks we will be looking at all our families and what makes families the same and different.

Birch and Cherry (Year 1)

This week in Year 1 we have enjoyed making our own stories about: 'The tiger who came to school'. See if your child can retell their story. To prompt them, you could ask: "What did the tiger eat?", "What mess did he make?", "Where did he hide?"

Our maths learning objective has been to order amounts and numerals from smallest to greatest or greatest to smallest. We have focussed on numbers within ten but see if your child can extend this to higher numbers. Any work you can do on writing numbers correctly would also be beneficial.

In Science this week, Cherry Class engaged in a fun 'senses' experiment to see what activities they could or could not complete whilst blindfolded. Birch Class look forward to doing the same next week.

In Geography we have continued to look at the countries that make up the UK and marked their locations on a map. Next week we will be talking more about the capital cities and adding these to the map.

In the last couple of weeks of D.T., we will be moving on to the practical stage of making a 'chair for a toy bear'. Please can we ask for donations of cardboard to fulfil this? Please can we ask that you try to ensure that any food packages brought in are from items that were nut free.

Lastly, we've already got a pile of un-named lost property, so please can you ensure that all uniform and outdoor clothes / wellies are clearly named.

Hazel and Rowan (Year 2)

It has been another busy week for year 2!


In English we have been writing recounts about our trip to Oxford Castle. The children have been learning how to write in chronological order, in the first person and how to use time conjunctions. When writing, we have also challenged ourselves to use powerful adjectives to describe.

In maths, the children have been learning how to use their knowledge of numbers bonds to ten to solve new problems. They have explored number bonds to 20 and 100 and looked at the patterns they can spot between all three.

In RE we have been thinking about kindness. We have read two different stories from the bible and have considered how kindness was shown or could have been shown. The children thought about ways we can be kind to each other and have been set the challenge to perform one act of kindness each day! Finally, in music the children have been learning about the difference between pulse and rhythm - ask your child if they can remember what these words mean!

This week in Bumblebees, the children have been using the Hama beads to produce some lovely designs. The children work very hard to concentrate for a long period of time to complete these.

We have enjoyed looking at books and using 'How to draw...' books to draw some amazing pictures!!
