Maple and Beech News (Reception)

This week in Reception we have learnt the sounds h, b, f (& ff), I (& II), ss. We have been writing sentences using the tricky words – I go to the.

We have been reading stories about families and using them to talk about how we are all the same and different. We have drawn pictures of our families and labelled them.

In maths we have continued focusing on the numbers 1, 2 and 3 this week. We have found and matched sets of objects to 3 and have begun to use the language more/fewer.

Please can you send in a photo of your child as a baby, we will be using this after half term to begin to talk about the past.

A PE kit reminder – as it is getting cold now, children need a navy tracksuit as well as their P.E shorts. Girls also need a pair of socks for PE if they come to school in tights.

Please can you check names in all your children's clothes over half term. We have lots of jumpers without names waiting to be claimed.

Please note that next term Maple Class will have their outdoor Learning on a Monday.

Birch and Cherry (Year 1)

In Year One, we have enjoyed the last week of our toys topic. The children used the Chromebooks or I-pads to type up sentences to create class books about toys. We look forward to reading it in class when it is all printed out.

In our computing lesson, we shared rules of how to use computers safely and considerately and the children designed posters to remind us of these.

In maths, we have continued to focus on addition and we have developed our knowledge of number bonds to speed up solving addition problems. See if your child can think of all the number bonds to make 10 (0+10, 1+9 etc.).

To complete our Science topic, we enjoyed tasting a marshmallow sweet treat which we toasted over the fire pit during our outdoor learning. We described the look of the marshmallow and how it changed as it was warmed by the flames.

We hope you all have a lovely and well-earnt half-term break. When we return, our topic will be 'Fairy Tales and Forests'. We would be happy for the children to bring in their own fairy tale books for us to read during story time. As part of our DT lessons, we will be looking at mechanisms to make moving pictures in books and we will be designing our own Fairy Tale based moving pictures. Again, if any children have any books with moving levers/wheels in at home, they would be handy to show as examples.

Hazel and Rowan (Year 2)

In English this week, Year 2 have been learning about the story of Saint George and the Dragon! Although it is not quite the right time of year for the story, it links so well with our topic about castles and knights. The children have enjoyed learning the story off by heart with lots of actions - ask your child if they can retell the story to you.

In maths we have been learning how to use our knowledge of number bonds to solve addition and subtraction problems. We have used tens frames, rekenreks and numbers lines to learn how to solve problems in lots of different ways. We have been so impressed with how well the children have persevered, even when the learning has been tricky.

On Friday we had a visit from Millets Falconry centre. The visitors brought in a range of birds of prey. The children had the chance to ask questions about the birds and even see them fly across the hall! It was an amazing experience.


