Little Acorns Pre-Nursery

What a lovely return back to the nursery.

The children have started their new topic- 'Why Do Leaves Go Crispy?' On Monday, the children had the opportunity to explore the woodland area. Whilst out and about, we used our eyes to see how many different coloured leaves we could find and tasked some children to sort them into piles of big and little leaves. The children enjoyed working together, making big piles of crunchy leaves to jump in. Back in the nursery, we have been using the leaves we collected from our trip in many creative ways, painting on leaves, leaf rubbing and finally gluing and sticking to create a leaf wreath for our class display.

We have been reading stories this week about fireworks. What noises they make, and how to be safe near them. The children enjoyed making their very own edible sparkler too.

Acorns (Nursery am and pm)

Welcome back! We hope you all had a very restful half term. This term our topic is 'Why Do Leaves Go Crispy?' We will be looking at the signs of Autumn throughout the term and going on an Autumn walk around the school to observe these changes.

This week we have been learning about Guy Fawkes and the role he played in why we celebrate Firework night. We talked about how we have to be careful around sparklers and fireworks.

In PE, we moved our bodies to firework noises and pretended to be rockets shooting up into the sky. We also started our weekly Yoga sessions with Mrs Sharratt. The children really enjoyed practising the different poses while going on a bear hunt! We are trying hard to take our shoes off and put them back on all by ourselves so please encourage your children to do this at home too.

In Maths, we have been looking at numbers to 10 and trying hard to recognise the numbers. We have been on a number hunt trying to spot the numbers around the nursery.

Maple and Beech News (Reception)

This week in Reception we have recapped on all the sounds we have learnt so far. We have completed phase 2 phonics now. Thank you to those who are returning books daily. Please can you make sure you sign the reading record so we have an idea who is reading at home.

We have been learning about Diwali. We have read about how Hindus and Sikhs celebrate Diwali, read and sequenced the story of Rama and Sita and made our own Diva lamps.

In maths we have been focusing on shapes this week. We have explored the properties of circles and triangles and made our own pictures, inspired by the geometric art of Kandinsky.

We have used our baby photos to begin to talk about things that happened 'in the past'. We have also explored how the seasons are changing outside.

Reminder – Beech class library books need to be returned by Tuesday and Maple class by Thursday, as these are our library days. Reading record and reading book need to come into school every day.

A P.E kit reminder – as it is getting cold now, children need a navy tracksuit as well as their P.E shorts. Girls also need a pair of socks for P.E if they come to school in tights.

Birch and Cherry (Year 1)

For our new year one topic of 'Fairy tales and forests', we have started to look at the story of Goldilocks and the Three Bears.

We used the 2Paint program on the I-pads to draw pictures of the characters and items in the story. We learnt to use the 'shape' and colour 'fill' tools to speed up the drawing process.

We also made labels and speech bubbles for our Goldilocks role-play areas. The children were introduced to the use of question marks. E.g. Who has been eating my porridge? See if your child can recall the questions asked by the three bears in the story.

In maths we have continued to look at addition. We have learnt how to use Rekenreks (like an abacus) to visualise and work out additions and we have told 'first' 'then' and 'now' stories to link addition to real life situations. E.g. First there were 3 children on a bus, then 5 more children got on, now there are? Some of the children also began to learn how to use numberlines to solve additions.

In our outdoor learning this week, we enjoyed watching a miniature Guy Fawkes burn on the fire. We also added some special powder to the flames and loved seeing the colour change to blue and green. The children were all very sensible, sitting still and following the safety rules.

You should all have received a note detailing the phonic sounds we have been working on this week: ay, ea, ie, aw, ue. Please keep working with your child on reading these sounds and the example words and we will send out some more next week.

Cherry Class parents - as of next week, we are going to move the Cherry class outdoor learning day from a Thursday afternoon to a Wednesday afternoon. Please continue to bring your child's outdoor learning clothes in on a Monday.

Hazel and Rowan (Year 2)

Welcome back to our new term - Beat, Band, Boogie topic. The children and staff thoroughly enjoyed the Junk Orchestra that we had perform at school on Wednesday afternoon. I am sure the children all came home and spoke about it. They enjoyed playing different instruments all made from junk. The children got to make their own shaker instrument as well.

In English we have been learning and performing a poem called 'The Sound Collector'. When then thought of our own sounds that we hear at school to record our own sound collector poem. We have been counting on and back in 10's using a number square and dienes and ones. The children have then used these methods to help add and subtract in multiples of 10. During outdoor learning we made our own shakers and instruments and created music and sang songs. We listened for manmade sounds and natural sounds in the environment.










Breakfast Bees and Bumblebees
