National Teachers' Strike

Little Acorns Class

This week in Little Acorns we have been celebrating Chinese New Year, the year of the Rabbit. The children have enjoyed learning and exploring with different themed activities such as making Chinese Lanterns, using our pencil control skills, using our sensory skills feeling different textures in the sensory tray and using our sitting and listening skills as we read our story, 'Peppa's Chinese New Year'.

During our snack time this week the children have had the opportunity to taste some Chinese foods such as prawn crackers and tangerines.

During our carpet time the children enjoyed learning how to say hello in Chinese (Ni Hao) and learnt a new song, Chinese Dragon - why not ask if your child can sing it to you over the weekend?

In maths we have been focusing on shape names and tried to describe each shape. The children have taken turns at shape puzzles and have tried hard to draw these shapes independently on the chalkboard.

Well done Little Acorns.

Acorns Class

This week in Acorns we have been learning all about Chinese New Year. This year is the year of the Rabbit.

In Literacy we heard the story of The Great Race and we enjoyed recreating this in our small world area.

The children were very good at making Chinese lanterns, practising their cutting skills. We then decorated the nursery with our lanterns.

The children tried some Chinese writing, and we learnt that Chinese writing goes from top to bottom!

Acorns class enjoyed listening to clips about how people in Chinese celebrate their New Year and in PE we used scarves to dance to traditional Chinese music and watched a Chinese Hand dance that we had fun trying too.





Maple and Beech News (Reception)

This week in phonics we have learnt th, ng, ai, ee digraphs. Our new tricky words are: all and they. We have practised reading and writing words with these sounds in.

In handwriting, we have continued to practise curly letters, a, d, g, q and s.

For the rest of the week have been busy preparing for our Chinese New Year assembly, we hope you enjoy it!

The children have had an Art afternoon where we wrote rabbit symbols in Chinese script, painted cherry blossom trees and made moving dragons and collage lanterns.

We practised our cooking skills and made spring rolls, then tasted them as well as lychees, prawn crackers and noodles.

We watched two performances of Chinese dances, a dragon and lion dance, we talked about which ones we preferred and why, then created our own dragon dance and used found objects outside to create the music.

Birch and Cherry (Year 1)

It's definitely been a frosty week however this has not dampened the children's spirits.

In English, they have been applying their text mapping skills to help them internalise the model text about Tim Peake. This made it possible for them to rewrite the text and understand the structure of a fact file.

This will support the children in writing a fact file about Neil Armstrong next week.

We have started adding in Maths and the children have been focussing on understanding the concept initially using concrete resources.

They have had the opportunity this week to apply their understanding of a sentence in their Computing work by learning to add capital letters to their typed work.

We had another great History lesson and the children got to explore Tim Peake's adventure into space by watching first-hand accounts of him and the fascinating things he was able to do. We're sure you'll hear all about it!

We had some fabulous artwork in the abstract style of Joan Miro using those bold colours and interesting shape and line to create an alien.

Hazel and Rowan (Year 2)

This week the children have been very excited in English as we have begun to plan and write about our very own 'marvellous medicines!' The children spent some time thinking of the most disgusting ingredients they would include in their mixtures and then thought about how it would look, taste and smell. The best part though was thinking about the effect their mixture would have on Grandma! Ask your child what their medicine would do to Grandma.

In maths, we have moved on to our new topic of multiplication. We have spent a lot of time this week working on recognising, making and adding equal groups. We have learned that multiplication is the same as repeated addition and have been writing number sentences to show this. We have also discussed the language that can be used when the see 'x' symbol such as 'lots of', 'groups of', 'times' and 'multiplied by'.

In history, the children have continued to learn about Florence Nightingale and the impact she had on modern day nursing. We discovered that Florence introduced many important hygiene rules to hospitals to help stop the spread of diseases and infections. We know that Florence is an important historical figure because she set up a nurse training school. Next week will be learning about another famous nurse - Mary Seacole and making comparisons between the two historical figures.


In outdoor learning, the children have continued to create art using paint made from natural materials. Last week, after our fire had been put out and cooled down, we collected the ashes and charcoal to use to create paint. We also used crushed sticks of chalk to add some colour to our work.
