Little Acorns Class

This week saw the nursery continue with the Easter theme.

The children loved mixing and stirring to make their very own Easter cakes. The children worked very hard painting their chicks and adding 'feathers' and produced some excellent focused work! They were very proud of their Easter Chicks and were so excited to take them home to show their families.

In literacy, we talked about different types of books, how some are story books, and others are information books. The children enjoyed listening to 'Spot's Easter surprise' and 'Spring' a fact book.

Outside, the children explored in the messy tray with children's scented purple and yellow foam body wash. The children thought about how to shape the foam with their hands or spoon and spread it using different utensils.

We practised our ball skills this week, thinking about how we throw and catch balls. We enjoyed group games on the carpet with different types of balls and used our words to describe how they looked and felt.

Acorns Class

This week in Acorns the children have learnt the story of Easter and why we celebrate it.

We started the week with an exciting art activity with Mrs Rose in the hall. The children loved going over to the school hall to have their lesson there.

We have been very busy with all things Easter related! The children have had fun making Easter cards and Easter nests.

The highlight of the week was an egg hunt – we all had such fun!

Maple and Beech News (Reception)

This week we have been learning about Easter. We have learnt how Christians celebrate the festival of Easter and how our Easter eggs represent new life. We have explored lots of different Easter crafts and been on an Easter egg hunt. We have written sentences about Easter pictures and found shapes in different Easter pictures.

In maths, we have been consolidating our understanding of the language of 'more than' and 'less than'.

In phonics, we have continued to consolidate our knowledge of the trickier digraphs and trigraphs in phase 3 and have moved on to phase 4 phonics.

We also had a Spring art morning, creating beautiful pastel flower drawings with Mrs. Rose. These look amazing displayed in the hall, we hope you spotted ours during parents' evening.

Birch and Cherry (Year 1)

Well done to Year 1 this week for a fantastic Easter Performance! We were very proud of all the acting, narrating and singing. A special thank you goes to Mrs Loupos-Read for organising and directing the play. Thank you also for your support at home to help the children learn their lines and practise the songs.

On Monday, the children enjoyed a special art session in the hall with Mrs Rose. We hope you enjoyed looking at their watercolour paintings of daffodils when you came in for Parent's Evening.

In English, the children finished off their non-fiction writing about hedgehogs, adding information about what hedgehogs eat and some extra 'fun facts'.

In phonics we have had a 'spot check' to assess and work on gaps in learning the phase 5 sounds. Please can you continue to help your child build their phonic knowledge and practise reading over the holidays.

In maths, we have been measuring the mass of objects with cubes and using mathematical language to compare the weight of two objects. See if your child can use the words: 'heavier' and 'lighter' correctly. Can they describe what would happen to bucket scales if one object is heavier than another? What would they notice on the scales if the mass of the two objects is the same?

We wish you all a lovely Easter break and we look forward to welcoming the children back for our new topic of 'Dinosaurs' after the holidays.



Hazel and Rowan (Year 2)

The children have enjoyed this last week of term.

In English we have been creating fact files on flowers which we will then put together as a class book. The children have worked hard to include the features of a fact file such as the heading, subheadings and pictures. We have also started our work on reading comprehension. The children have read a passage of text and answered questions about what they have read. We will continue this next term in preparation for our SATs.

In maths we have been adding and subtracting and using the expanded column method. It is important that the children show their workings out. The expanded column method looks like this



In History we have been learning about the Wright brothers and how they invented the first planes. We studied the different designs of the first plane and then made our own paper aeroplanes and tested how far they could fly.

We have continued to learn about plants and have studied the lifecycle of a bean and have enjoyed watching our seeds grow in different environments.

If any parents or grandparents would be able to come and help listen to readers next term then Year 2 would very much appreciate the help. We hope that you enjoy your Easter break and your Easter cards.
