Little Acorns Class

This week in Little Acorns we have been learning a new song about a worm called 'Wiggly Woo'. See if your children can sing it to you! We have also been reading 'The Very Busy Spider'. The children have been joining in with the animal noises, using their words to identify them and re-telling the story using puppets.

The children have been making different length playdough 'worms' and used 2D shapes to build minibeast homes. They have practised their fine motor control skills with writing minibeast letters, painting minibeasts at the easel and using brushes to make marks on the chalkboard outside.

We have been busy planting lots of seeds in the garden area this week: wildflowers for the bees, cress seeds in little individual pots as well as salad vegetables. The children have also enjoyed continuing to develop their yoga poses in our daily sessions.

Now a few polite requests please:

- All children need to bring in a water bottle to their sessions that it is clearly named.
- The Little Acorns library books are enjoyed by all children please return it the following week to be swapped for a new one.

Acorns Class

This week in nursery we looked at the story of 'Superworm'. The children tried hard to answer questions about the story and predict what might happen. To link in with 'Superworm', during outdoor learning we made cheerio worms and went on a bug hunt using magnifying glasses.

In maths have focussed on length. The children can order items of different lengths. We learnt that length is the measurement for how long something is and we used language - long, longer, longest and short, shorter and shortest.

The children had fun role-playing restaurants this week, with lots of children taking meal orders and serving each other. We had lots of fun having picnics outside in the sun too!

In PE the children have learned to 'dodge' each other by doing a side step to avoid the catchers. We have also practised our marching skills ready for the King's Coronation.

Next week we will be learning all about the coronation with a focus on the King's Guards.

Maple and Beech News (Reception)

This week in phonics we have learnt the new vocabulary – vowels (a, e, i, o, u,) and consonants (the other letters of the alphabet) and have started reading longer words (CVCC) words such as champ, tenth and sixth. We are also continuing to practise reading and writing sentences using tricky words (some, come, there, like, what, out, little, were, said, when).

In Literacy we have adapted the story – 'Going on a bear hunt' to 'Going on a hunt.' The children have drawn their own story maps and some children have written labels and captions to go with these.

In Maths we have continued to look at numbers above 10, counting on and back to 20 and identifying any missing numbers on a number line, as well as making 'teen' numbers with tens frames and multilink towers.

In other areas we have used positional language to give directions to a partner and looked at how our environment has changed now Spring is in full bloom.

Birch and Cherry (Year 1)

It was an exciting week for Year 1 this week with their trip to the Oxford Natural History Museum. They saw lots of dinosaur skeletons and fossils, including the remains of the first dinosaur ever to be discovered, the Megalosaurus, which was found in Oxfordshire. The dinosaur workshop gave the children a hands-on experience of several bones, teeth and even fossilised dinosaur poo! Well done to all of Year 1 for their focus and enthusiasm on the trip and thank you to all the parent helpers.

On Wednesday, we wrote a recount of our time at the museum, focussing on our use of the past tense and using full sentences with capital letters and full stops or exclamation marks. Our spelling/grammar focus this week was the use of the suffix 'er' to change adjectives into comparative adjectives (e.g. tall into taller) and to change verbs into nouns (e.g. bake into baker). We also answered some comprehension questions after reading about the life of King Charles III.

In preparation for our celebration of King Charles' coronation, Birch class made some union flags with tissue paper. They added the special 'coronation logo' to the centre of the flags. Cherry class made some beautiful crowns to wear next Friday. We look forward to lots more King themed activities next week, with each class creating their own table-top display.

In maths this week we have continued to develop our understanding of counting in equal groups. The children were introduced to the use of 'arrays' to represent multiplication with rows and columns and they wrote matching repeated addition sentences. They also revised their knowledge of doubles (within and beyond 10).

Hazel and Rowan (Year 2)

This week we have started to talk and teach the children about the King's Coronation. We explained to the children that we were not alive when the Queen had her coronation so it has been a new learning experience for us all. We have been challenged by Mrs Rose to create a display for one aspect of the King's Coronation. Hazel class have been learning about the robes that the King will wear on the day and Rowan class have been learning about the carriage that will carry the King to his Coronation. Hopefully the children will be able to tell you some of the facts that they have learnt.

The children enjoyed finishing off the 'Walter Worm' story in English this week as well as completing a comprehension about King Charles III.

We have continued with looking at halves and quarters of shapes and numbers. We encouraged the children to draw the number of parts and then share the number between the parts making sure that they are all equal.

This week was our first week of Mindfulness Yoga which the children really enjoyed. We learnt what the word yoga meant and how we can all work together. The children and staff can't wait for our next session.

In computing we have been looking at directions and creating a sequence of directions for a Beebot.

In RE we have continued to study Islam and the Salat or Salah and the different times of day that Muslims pray and the different movements and gestures used.



This week in Bumblebees we have been very busy. Some of the children have been helping Mrs Buchan to design and paint an entry for the Newbury Coronation Bunting competition. They have produced a lovely design that we will take to the Corn Exchange - keeping our fingers crossed to win! We have also started to make our annual scarecrow to put out for the May half term scarecrow competition. The children have been enjoying some quiet time in our reading corner with our older children reading the younger ones!
