## **Little Acorns Class**

This week in Little Acorns the children have been learning about 2D shapes. The children have enjoyed drawing the shapes, cutting them out using the playdough and matching the shapes up by gluing and sticking them at the craft table.

They have also really enjoyed the apple printing with the paints and we have been reading the story "Pip and Posy the Super Scooter" along with learning our nursery rhymes.

The children are now very good at singing and doing the actions to our song of the term 'Open, shut them' - ask them to sing it to you!

Outside in the garden the children have really enjoyed practising their cutting skills by using the scissors to cut and snip the leaves in the Autumn tray.

Hopefully you have all been able to access your child's Seesaw account using the QR codes that have been provided (please let us know if you have any problems accessing the account.) We hope you enjoy looking at the photos showing lots of the wonderful activities that your children have been taking part in.

#### **Acorns Class**

This week the children have been looking at people who help us in the community. We had a police station role play area and they enjoyed dressing up as police and fire officers. The children had a lovely discussion about the different ways they can help and how to call someone if they need help.

During October we have been celebrating Black History Month by learning about different people who have been inspirational in the past. We have learnt all about Rosa Parks who was very brave and refused to give up her seat on the bus just because of the colour of her skin.

We had a lovely outdoor learning session and had our first fire circle! The children were very good and followed the rules of a fire circle. We also had roasted marshmallow in a chocolate biscuit! A smore!!! It was delicious!

## Maple and Beech News (Reception)

In English this week we read Elmer stories and designed our own elephants. We also wrote lists of colours and captions about our elephants.

In art we were inspired by Tanawat Suriyatongtam to create collage elephant pictures.

In maths we have been thinking about how 5 is made up of smaller numbers and problem solving within 5. We have put a game related to this on Seesaw.

We have been thinking about rules at school and at home and what our responsibilities are.

## **Birch and Cherry (Year 1)**

In maths this week we have been adding two numbers under ten. We have learnt how to do this on a tens frame using cubes and have begun to work out addition using a number line. If you can practise adding over the holidays that would be great. Well done to the children who have been using Doodle maths to support our lessons.

We have finished our Toys topic in History by making videos where we pretended to be curators in a museum. The children talked through the different toys, using the terms 'past' and 'present.' They were great at this!

Our topic next half term is 'To Infinity and Beyond' where we will be learning about the Space Race and Neil Armstrong's achievements. Can you find out about Neil Armstrong over the holidays and then share your learning when we come back.

We hope you have a great half term.

## Hazel and Rowan (Year 2)

In true year 2 style, we have been very busy this week finishing off all of our topics.

In English we have been reading the story of St George and the Dragon. We learned the story off by heart and retold it using actions to help us remember the key events. The only problem was, the story was a bit... simple. We decided that such a brave knight, like St George, deserved an exciting, nail-biter of a story, so we re-wrote the story with exciting adjectives and noun phrases. The stories were amazing!

In maths we have been learning about multiplication and division. We have learned how to use resources and written methods to solve problems and explore the 2x tables. We used arrays to show that multiplication **is** commutative (ask your child if they can tell you what that word means!) and sharing hoops helped us discover that division, **is not** commutative.

We have been getting very messy in art over the last week (apologies, parents!) as we have been using clay to create our very own castles. We learned the techniques for joining clay - score, slip, stick and smooth and put these into practice making castles that we had previously designed. Our castles are very creative - some are very realistic, and some children have gone for a more abstract approach!

In yoga, we learned about a new part of the brain - the amygdala (although we have been calling it our 'lizard brain'). We learned that our lizard brain is great for helping to keep us safe in dangerous situations, but sometimes it can make us think we are in danger when we are not. We practised controlling our lizard brains with deep breathing and reminding ourselves that we are safe.

It has been a fantastic first half term for the children in year 2 and we are incredibly proud of all of them for how well they have settled and how hard they have worked. Next term, our topic is 'Winter Wonderland" - how exciting!



Bumblebees have been very busy this week with Halloween crafts! We have made some spooky pictures using sand and glue which are on display in the Bumblebees room. The children have also been busy making and trialling ramps for the vehicles – some have been more successful than others!
