Little Acorns Class

This week in Little Acorns this week the children have been learning about nocturnal and diurnal animals and they have really enjoyed finding out and discussing facts about them.

We have been reading the story, "A Cold Dark Night" and "Owl Babies" and the children have loved learning our song, 'Dingle Dangle Scarecrow'.

We have also been having some Children in Need fun and have made some Pudsey headbands to wear at home and baked some Pudsey biscuits to sell to make some money for Children in Need.

The children have also had lots of fun making their hedgehog leaf pictures using the leaves we have collected from the garden and they have enjoyed practising their cutting skills by using the scissors to cut around shapes.

Outside in the garden the children have had fantastic fun riding the bikes and scooters (weather permitting) and practising their counting skills using the large wooden threading disks.

Acorns Class

This week in Acorns we have been learning all about nocturnal animals. We have read the story 'One Cold Night' where the hedgehog is looking for his home. The children understand that nocturnal animals come out at night time – well done! We have made a lovely display of the story and made collage animals, using tissue paper, feathers, paper and material.

In outdoor learning we used our sense of touch to find different items that were spiky, smooth, wet, bumpy! "This stone is smooth." "This stick is bumpy."

In science we made Children in Need cookies to sell on Friday - thank you to all those who brought a cookie! The children had a fun Friday celebrating Children in Need wearing an item of spotty clothing and colouring Pudsey pictures!

Maple and Beech News (Reception)

In phonics this week, we learned the sounds z (and zz), qu, ch and sh and the tricky words we, me, be and my.

In maths, we have been focusing the numbers 6, 7 and 8 and investigating the smaller numbers within those.

In science and literacy, we learned about nocturnal animals, learning to draw, sort and label them.

In RE, we have been learning about festivals of light this term. This week we learned about Eid al Fitr and Channukah.

In outdoor learning, we begun to learn how to use saws to make wood slices for Christmas decorations.

Please can you send in spare socks with your child. We have none left in school and as the weather is very wet, children often need a change of socks.

Please can you recheck all your child's PE kit is labelled and check they have PE trousers as well as shorts, we need both weekly.

Birch and Cherry (Year 1)

In maths this week we have been learning about fractions. We have been finding halves and quarters of different shapes, making sure each part is equal. We have used playdoh to help us to understand this tricky concept.

In English we have been learning all about non-chronological reports. We have been reading about Tim Peake and have learnt lots of interesting facts about him! We have also been learning how to make plurals by adding -s.

We have started to practise our class dance for the Christmas production and learn the songs too. The children are working hard on this!

Lots of children are not bringing the correct kit in for Outdoor Learning. Children need waterproof trousers, a waterproof coat and wellies in this weather as we go outside every week. Please make sure your child has the correct kit. If you have any questions or concerns, please come and speak to us in the door after school.

Hazel and Rowan (Year 2)

Year 2 have been busy bees this week!

In English we have been learning to write setting descriptions. We read a model text and thought about how the author had used their senses to create a picture of the summer setting. We broke the model text down into each sense and thought about alternative ideas for each one. We have started to think about writing our own setting descriptions for a winter scene (linked to our topic, Winter Wonderland!) Why not ask your child about the different things they might see, hear, smell, touch or taste during the winter months.

In maths we have continued our topic on measure. We have moved on from measuring length and mass to beginning to measure volume and capacity. We learned that capacity describes the amount that a container could hold, whilst volume measures how much liquid is actually in a container, regardless of its capacity. We had great fun using water and a range of containers to explore volume and capacity - though it did get messy!

In science we have been learning about animals, including humans. This week we talked about the things that all animals need to survive, including water, food and air. We thought about the difference between wants and needs and sorted a range of items under these headings. We came to the conclusion that as much as we all WANT cake and PlayStations... we do not need these things to survive! This lesson prompted some great discussion from the children.

This week we also enjoyed a wonderful assembly from the school council about Children in Need. We loved learning about this amazing charity and how we can support them. Each class baked delicious, spotty cookies and we can't wait to share them with you.

Finally, in PE this week we have started to choreograph our dances for the Christmas performance. Each class has been given a location from around the world to theme their dance around. Hazel class will be basing their dance on Africa and Rowan class on Antarctica!
