Little Acorns Class

It is lovely to have all the children back in Nursery and a big welcome to all our new children. We hope you all had a lovely Christmas break.

This week the children have been learning about our homes. If you have any photos of your home for the children to bring in and show at group time that would be lovely!

They have really enjoyed having a go at drawing their own homes and adding the features such as windows and doors.

We have been reading the story 'Home' along with learning our rhyme of the term, 'It's raining, it's pouring' which has certainly been relevant!

Outside in the garden the children have been having fun riding the bikes and scooters and learning new ball and hoop skills.

Acorns Class

Welcome back! We hope you all had a lovely break. Firstly, thank you so much for your generous gifts at Christmas!

This term in Acorns, our topic is, 'How does that building stay up?' We will be looking at different buildings in our community, what they are used for and how they are made. We will be investigating different materials and finding out which materials are stronger than others. Could we ask that you upload a picture of your house to seesaw so that we can show the children a range of different houses? Mrs Tanner will be uploading some buildings from around the village to see if the children recognise them and what they may be used for.

As the weather is much colder this term, please remember to send your child in with hats/gloves/scarves and layer up on outdoor learning days. Please also remember to name your child's belongings.

Maple and Beech News (Reception)

In phonics this week we have recapped all the learning so far, focussing on blending and writing the sounds.

In maths we have been looking at shapes – circles and triangles. We have been exploring these through different activities such as looking for them in the environment and making pictures. Perhaps you can help them to look for these shapes while at home too?

In literacy we have learnt the story of 'The Little Red Hen' off by heart. Ask your child if they can tell you the story.

We have talked about our Christmas holidays and New Year and what it means to make a New Year's resolution.

Please can you ensure your child has a full PE kit in school each week. They need to have shorts and the PE top for gymnastics, for safety reasons they must wear shorts for gymnastics. They also need the full tracksuit each week as Danny does PE outside as long as it is dry.

Birch and Cherry (Year 1)

A lovely first week back after the Christmas holidays, the children have settled back into their routines and learning.

In Maths this week we have been looking at 2D and 3D shapes. We have explored their names and properties as well as making shapes with lolly sticks and straw. Can you find some shapes around your home? What shape did you see the most?

In English we have been exploring our new topic of Fairy tales. Our focus at the moment is on 'Goldilocks and the Three Bears.' The children have enjoyed learning the story and acting out the story in the role-play too. Can you tell you grown-ups the story?

In Art we have enjoyed making artwork inspired by Andy Goldsworthy using natural materials. It was lots of fun and we worked together in teams to make some beautiful patterns.

Hazel and Rowan (Year 2)

It has been a great start to our spring term this week! It was so lovely to see all of those happy and wonderful faces back in class after such a lovely break away from school. It has been so nice to hear about all the great things Year 2 have been up to in the holidays!

In Maths this week we are learning all about 2-D and 3-D shapes. We have been recapping the names of different shapes and have taken a closer look at them to identify some of the shape properties! We have focused a lot on shape sides and the best way to count these as well as guessing shapes by just knowing how many sides it has! Can you ask your child how many sides a hexagon has?

In English this week we have been building upon our comprehension skills and we have started a really funny and interesting book called 'George's Marvellous Medicine' By Roald Dahl. He is our new author of the term and all of us in Year 2 are really looking forward to reading his weird and wonderful books! We have also been learning a model text which is a character description all about the main character George from our book. We are hoping that in the next few weeks we can write our own character description on Grandma!

In history this week we have started our topic all about historical and famous nurses. We have been introduced to a famous nurse called Florence Nightingale. We came up with many questions we wish we could ask her about her work and about being a nurse during the Crimean war! Hopefully as we learn more about her and other famous nurses, we can uncover some answers to some of the questions we had!



We've had a busy but fun week back. We've welcomed some new friends this term that have settled in really well.

We've shared our holiday news and talked about our Christmas. It sounds like you have all had a wonderful time!
