This week at Mrs Bland's we have been very busy preparing for Easter! The Year 1 Easter Assembly is coming along nicely and the children have all worked so hard. We look forward to inviting Year 1 parents in next week to share it.

Year R had an exciting start to the week on Tuesday when they went to Rushall Farm for the day. The children all came back with smiles on their faces despite the rain. Thank you to our wonderful parent/carer helpers, we couldn't do it without you!

Another "thank you" to Mrs Harris who comes into school weekly to help to keep our garden areas tidy. The difference hasn't gone unnoticed and we are very grateful!

A reminder that school closes at 1:45pm next Wednesday and Bumblebees for those already booked, will be running until 4:15pm.

Nursery funding update

We wanted to make everyone in school aware of the new funding changes that are coming into place from the start of the Summer term. There will be further changes rolled out in September 2025 for our children aged 2 upwards.

- Currently, eligible working parents of 3 and 4year-olds can access <u>30 hours of</u> <u>childcare</u> support.
- From April 2024, eligible working parents of 2year-olds will be able to access 15 hours <u>childcare</u> support.
- From September 2024, 15 hours childcare support will be extended to eligible working parents with a child from 9-months-old.
- From September 2025, support will reach 30 hours for eligible working parents with a child from 9-months-old up to school age.

Needless to say our nurseries (age 2-4) are filling up very quickly! If you would like a place for September 2024 or even September 2025, then you can download a copy of our application from from the school website, or pop into the office for a hard copy.

Little Acorns Class

This week we have been reading Easter stories; 'Spots Easter story' and 'Peppa's Easter story' and have been talking about all the different things that happen at Easter time.

We have been continuing to practise our new rhyme of the term 'Mary had a little lamb' and practising number rhymes and have been learning some new Easter songs 'I am a spring chicken'.

The children have also been enjoying exploring in the Easter sensory trays.

In our craft area we have been busy making our Easter cards and Easter crafts.

Outside in the garden, the children have really enjoyed exploring and looking out for any new signs of spring.

Acorns Class

This week the children have been busy learning all about Easter and why we celebrate Easter. The children helped make an Easter garden and have planted cress seeds in it which they will watch grow.

During outdoor learning we have been planting lots of vegetables. We know that the seeds will need water and sun to help them grow. The children are very good at helping to water the vegetable patch!

In maths we have been using scales to weigh different items. We use the mathematical language of 'heavier' and 'lighter' when weighing.

During science we did an experiment to see what material would protect an egg. We put eggs in bags and filled them with different materials. We then went outside to drop the bags and observed what would happen. The children thought the bag with the cotton wool in would keep the egg safe, but the bag with the paper in would not. We all enjoyed watching the eggs drop to the ground to find out what would happen!



Maple and Beech News (Reception)

In phonics we have been reading 2 syllable words such as rooftop, jacket and chicken, as well as revising all phase 2 and 3 tricky words and sounds.

In Literacy we have finished our non-fiction books about the farm adding title pages, blurbs and a contents page.

In maths we have been exploring 3D shapes, describing them using the vocabulary, 'curved surface' or 'flat faces' and practising naming them; cube, cuboid, cylinder, pyramid, sphere. Can you find some examples of these at home and see you if can say the correct name?

The children were all superbly behaved at the farm, despite the drizzly weather and the mud! They saw cows, sheep and chickens. They also went on a tractor trailer ride, compared old and new tractors, made butter and had a go at grinding wheat into flour. Thank you to all the parent helpers!

Birch and Cherry (Year 1)

This week have we been preparing for our Easter Assembly on Wednesday. We can't wait to show you what we have been working hard on for the last few weeks. Please continue to practise your lines at home, especially saying them loudly and clearly.

The children have been enjoying visiting the library each with Mrs Marshall to return their own book and choose a new book of interest, as well as hear a story. Please can you bring your book every Wednesday to swap it for a new one. If you are unsure which book you have borrowed then please feel free to ask us and we can check on the system for you.

In D.T we have continued making our cars from recycled cardboard boxes and bottles. We added wheels and decoration this week. Finally, we gave them a test drive with a toy animal to make sure they worked. The children have worked very hard on their vehicle creations - well done!

Hazel and Rowan (Year 2)

The last full week of this half term is complete! The children in Year 2 are continuing to work hard as always and are making their teachers proud!

In English we have been drafting our fact files and have created our own plants to write about. It has been amazing to see the incredible imagination of all the children coming up with their own plants with all sorts of different properties. Drafting our fact files has also enabled us to recap on all the features we need to include in our writing and it has been a great opportunity for us to edit our own work - which is an important Year 2 skill!

In Maths this week we have focussed on division. We have learnt two types of division - grouping and sharing. We have had some great practical lessons where we have been finding lots of different objects around the classroom and outside to help support our grouping or sharing division problems.

In Geography this whole half term, we have been learning about a village called Kampong Ayer. We have been working on comparing the village to our village of Burghfield. We have learnt a range of differences and similarities, and this week's focus was all about transport. The children loved completing a survey on each other about how we travel to school and we then compared our results to that of people in Kampong Ayer. Our most popular modes of transport were walking and by car in Burghfield - in comparison to by boat and walking in Kampong Ayer.

Reminder that all children need to have the correct PE kits and outdoor learning gear in school throughout the week please as Year 2 have PE on Mondays, Tuesdays and Fridays. It's a lot easier to bring in on a Monday and keep it in all week in case of any unforeseen changes to the timetable. Thank you!
