Little Acorns Class

It is lovely to have all the children back in Nursery and to welcome all the new starters, we hope you all had a lovely Easter break and are ready for a new and exciting Summer term.

This week in Little Acorns we have been reading the story, 'Giraffes Can't Dance' and been learning our new rhyme of the term 'Open, Shut them'. We have also been recapping on our routines and expectations and have shown our new starters how we share and are kind to one another within our nursery.

The children have been enjoying dancing on the carpet with the coloured scarfs and musical instruments.

Outside in the garden, the children have really enjoyed riding the bikes and scooters and learning to balance on the balance tubes.

Please can you make sure that we have a full change of clothes including socks and a supply of nappy bags and wipes in your child's bags, thank you.

Acorns Class

Welcome back! We hope you all had a lovely half term break.

This term our topic is 'Why do spiders eat flies?' We will be learning all about insects and what they eat and how to identify an insect.

This week we have been looking at the story of 'The Very Hungry Caterpillar'. We have been trying to learn the sequence of the days of the week and knowing what day we are on each day. We have also been trying to put pictures from the story into the right order.

In maths we have been looking at 2D shapes. We have been describing the shapes using the words straight, long, short, curved. We have also been learning what number is 1 more and 1 less than a given number. We ordered the numbers to 10 and then then hid a number. The children then had to find the missing number.

In science we looked at different materials that would help a spider stay at the top of the drain pipe.

Maple and Beech News (Reception)

In phonics, we have moved on to Phase 4. This week we recapped lots of our Phase 3 digraphs and learnt the new tricky words – do, so, come, some, have and like.

In Literacy we have learnt to retell the story of the Bear Hunt. We have made textile and digital maps to help us retell the story in the right order. We have also role-played the story inside and through outdoor learning and explored the Bear hunt settings using sensory trays.

In Maths we have moved on to learning about teen numbers. We have explored how the numbers 11-19 are formed with numicon pieces, for example, we have learnt to use the sentence stem: I can see 10 and 3 more, 13 is 10 and 3 more. We have encouraged children to use these sentences to explain how they know what a number is.

In RE we are using different stories to learn about moral messages. This week we read the story 'The boy who cried wolf'. We used this to talk about the importance of telling the truth.

Birch and Cherry (Year 1)

This week has been such an exciting week in Year One with a great start to our new dinosaur topic.

On Tuesday we went to Oxford Museum of Natural History. We had an amazing time looking at the exhibitions of fossils, dinosaur bones and skeletons. In the workshop we got to work as scientists and handle real fossils and bones to help us discover more about dinosaurs. We also got to hold a real Tyrannosaurus tooth, fossils, bones and even a fossilised dinosaur poo! Thank you to our parent helpers who came with us.

Another big thank you to the art department at The Willink School, as on Wednesday we had an art workshop where we worked with clay to create our own dinosaur. The children all really enjoyed it and we are looking forward to getting them back from the kiln so we can paint them before we display them.

Hazel and Rowan (Year 2)

How lovely it has been to see all the children back looking refreshed and ready for a new term. Now that the sun has started making an appearance, we look forward to extending our learning in our garden areas.

Our new topic is 'Wriggle and Crawl' and the children have had a great time innovating the story of Walter the Worm with their own exciting ideas.

The children have shown impressive understanding of our Maths unit about length and height. They have been able to articulate their learning using mathematical vocabulary and have applied their learning a range of problems.

We have a very exciting new topic in History; 'The Age of Discovery!' The children will be exploring significant events beyond living memory and how seafaring has changed over the last 450 years, from simple canoes to steam boats. They will learn about the famous explorers – Zheng He and John Cabot, and the steam boats designed by Isambard Kingdom Brunel.

In Science this week we have compared the differences between things that are living, dead and have never been alive. We will continue our exploration by looking more closely at how living things are suited to their habitats.



This week we have been settling back into our routines and welcoming our new starters to Breakfast Bees and Bumblebees. The children have been sharing their holiday news with us, it has been lovely to hear their stories.
