Governor News

What Do the School Governors Do?

Arguably, one of our most important responsibilities is to recruit the Headteacher. Once we've recruited the Headteacher we hand over the day-to-day running of the school to her/him. This means that ordinarily, governors don't get involved in the nitty gritty of daily tasks, however we do come into the school on agreed occasions to see what's going on and ensure the children are safe, happy and receiving a broad, exciting education that makes them want to come to school.

The governors also come into school in the evening and during the school day to attend meetings with the Headteacher and Deputy Headteacher and sometimes other senior staff. These meetings allow governors to question the senior leaders about the performance of the school, asking for evidence to support their answers. Governors' questioning covers all aspects of school life, whether it be the safety and well-being of the children, the children's achievements, the management of staff, the running and agreement of the school budget, the maintenance of the school premises and more besides. We also offer support to the Headteacher in many ways as we acknowledge that it is a very demanding role. Governors come from different backgrounds with diverse vocational experiences and their ideas, skills and knowledge can help with strategic planning and decision making.

Governors' meetings also involve the review and adoption of policies and procedures that provide the framework for the way in which the school is run. We also decide the direction of travel of the school, for example, what sort of school we want Mrs Bland's to be to best meet the needs of all of our pupils.

If you're interested in finding out more about the work of the governors, we have a dedicated area on the school website with more information, or please feel free to contact the clerk to governors via the school office. We're currently looking for more governors to join the board and soon we'll be holding a parent governor election. We're also looking to recruit new governors from the wider community who aren't necessarily parents or have a direct association with the school, but who are community-minded and have an interest in helping the next generation of children get the most out of their time at Mrs Bland's.

Little Acorns Pre-Nursery

Welcome back! We hope you all had a wonderful half term and are ready and raring to begin our new topic - 'Are Eggs Alive?' The children have all enjoyed a chance to make and eat pancakes this week, we worked very hard to weigh out the flour, pour the milk and whisk the egg! We have started to notice the change spring brings and have begun to make our own blossom prints. We have looked at information books telling us the names of different farm animals and the names of their young- we all practised the different sounds farm animals can make too e.g. pig, cow, sheep. Please can I remind all to name your child's water bottles and welly boots- this is very helpful to the staff when items are lost or being argued over! Thank you.

Acorn (Nursery am and pm)

This term in Acorns our topic is 'Are Eggs Alive?' The children have been looking at a non-fiction book that gives us information about eggs and chicks. The children were very good at finding the page numbers!

During this topic we will be learning about how different things grow... from eggs into chicks and the life cycle of animals to plant seeds and looking after them and watching them grow. This week we have planted some cress seeds. The children have been patiently waiting for them to start growing.

Next week we are celebrating Book Week. The author we are learning about is Eric Carle. Please remember that Friday is dress as a character from an Eric Carle story. If you have any questions please ask one of the nursery team.

Maple and Beech News (Reception)

This week we have started our new topic 'Things That Grow'. We have been learning all about garden centres in Beech class and we even had a special visitor to come in to talk to us about them to help us in our role-play area. Maple class have been looking at a greengrocers shop and discussing what they sell. They are planning to visit a greengrocer soon.

In maths we have been focusing on number. We have done lots of counting, finding numbers to match an amount and some addition. Next week we will continue to build upon this and also look at subtraction.

We have a very exciting and fun week ahead; we have our farm trip on Tuesday and it is Book Week where we will be visiting the library on Thursday, dressing up on Friday and having grown ups in to read with us on Wednesday. There is no Forest School for Maple next week due to the farm trip but Beech's Forest School will be going ahead on Thursday morning as usual.

Birch and Cherry (Year 1)

Year 1 have settled back into work well this week.

Our new topic is all about animals and the children have been very enthusiastic, finding out about different animals and sharing their knowledge. They are really looking forward to the animal roadshow next Tuesday.

In English and history we have been learning about Sir David Attenborough and all the work he has done for the environment and educating us about animals.

In Maths we have been revising our addition and subtraction skills using numberlines and using this strategy to help us solve problems.

In Science we are looking at the different types of animals and sorting them into groups.

In DT this term we are exploring healthy eating. We started this week by looking at different types of fruit and vegetables and learning about how they grow, either above the ground or below it.

Hazel and Rowan News (Year 2)

Year 2 have begun their new topic 'The Scented Garden'. We were very lucky to have Mrs Lewis come in to talk about how plants release their scents and she even left us some scented plants of our own to plant and look after! This week in English, Year 2 have begun to create their own fact files on common garden flowers. They have worked in pairs to find and record information. Perhaps they could tell you all about their selected flower? In Maths, the children have been recapping measure, reminding themselves of volume and capacity. We have also practised giving change- setting up our own shops and giving shoppers the correct changes. We finished the week by solving problems involving change and working carefully to make sure we knew exactly how to find the answer. Many thanks for your offers of help with reading and Forest School - we really appreciate any extra parent support! If you are interested in coming in to help with planting or general gardening, please let us know!

Breakfast Bees and Bland's Bumblebees (Before and After School Club)


