School News

This week saw the introduction of Lateral flow tests for school staff by the NHS. As 1 in 3 people are currently asymptomatic, the idea is we can break the transmission chain by regular testing. This does mean there's more chance of children needing to come home to isolate if they've been in contact with a positive test case. On a positive note, it also means we can then reduce the spread of Covid19 within the local community.

Little Acorns Pre-Nursery

Hello Little Acorns, it's been really lovely to speak to you all this week and to see your responses to the activities on Seesaw. We need to say a big Well done to the Mummies and Daddies who have posted videos or photos of the children at home working hard. You're all doing a wonderful job.

This week we have been read the story of Pip and Posy- The bedtime frog, thinking about what makes a good friend. In maths this week we looked at a few different shapes. We learnt how to describe the shape and what colour the shape was. We even went on a shape hunt around my house!

We sang tap, tap box together and sang the song 'Zoom, Zoom, Zoom'. This song helps us to learn how to count down from 5 to 0- I hope all the grown-ups joined in too?

Acorn (Nursery am and pm)

Well done to all the children who are working so hard with the remote learning sessions, Seesaw and the learning packs, as well as to all the children who are joining in so well in Nursery. Please let us know if there is any way we can help you with the remote learning.

With our topic, 'How Many Colours in the Rainbow?', this week we have been exploring the colours white and black in the story 'Polar Bear, Polar Bear, What do You Hear?' . We have been learning polar bear counting rhymes, exploring how to mix colours, and having fun exploring the snow and ice! We have made ice balloons with treasure inside, masks for the animals in the Polar Bear story, and we have learned about animals that live in cold places. Next week we will be exploring Elmer stories, and learning about how we are all different and special. Keep an eye on Seesaw for more resources and to see what else we are learning!

Maple and Beech News (Reception)

This week we have been creative with the gingerbread man story. The children have thought about the ending and drawn pictures and written labels and sentences for their own new endings, some of which were very imaginative! In Maths we have been exploring different measures using non-standard units. Using books to measure how tall they are and using water, flour, mud and pasta to help them talk about capacity. The children were able to use words like, full, empty, half full, nearly empty, nearly full to describe how much 'stuff' was in their containers. As well as counting how many cups, hands, spoons filled their different sized containers. In topic we have tried some different experiments; seeing if we can make a superfast soap boat, testing out origami boats and seeing how long a gingerbread man can survive in water if he fell in!

Birch and Cherry (Year 1)

In English we have been thinking about different adjectives to describe Mr Wolf's character and have also written our own ending to the story. We have started work in our new Maths books and have been learning about number bonds to 10 and 20 to help us with addition. Some of the methods have been quite challenging but well done to everyone for persevering.

In Geography we have learnt about the four main points of a compass and made our own compasses. In school we found out which way is North, South, East and West in the classroom.

We have enjoyed making music by singing and playing instruments. It has been very interesting to see all the different objects that you have found at home to make sounds.

Hazel and Rowan News (Year 2)

In writing this week, everyone has worked hard on answering comprehension questions based on chapters 5 and 6 of George's Marvellous Medicine. The children have used both the knowledge of the story and the text to help them, and are getting much better at answering in full sentences. They have also learnt about the features of diaries by reading examples of different diary entries and identifying these, such as the use of the first person. We're really pleased with the children's own diary entries, written as if they were George, as they have used lots of their own exciting adjectives and noun phrases, as well as some from the story, and they were able to maintain the use of the first person in their work as well as refer to events in the story. It was lovely to hear some of the children reading their George's diaries on Teams, and they seemed very proud of their work.

Year 2 have enjoyed learning about equal groups, repeated addition and multiplication in maths this week, using the new maths books linked with the videos. Some children have also used practical equipment to help them to understand how to make and add equal groups.

In history, we have learnt about another important nurse, Mary Seacole, and why she's remembered, and in RE, the children have been learning more about the Passover meal and significance of the food on the Seder plate. They all enjoyed drawing different foods on their own Seder plates and explaining why it's important to them. Year 2 have also learnt about pollution, its effects on our planet, and what we can do to help.

Keep up all the fantastic work Year 2!
