Little Acorns Pre-Nursery

This week in Little Acorns the children visited the Acorns nursery- or 'big nursery' as we call it. This is the first step in helping to transition the children ready for September. Some children enjoyed playing in the 'The Three Little Pigs' small world tray, following on from our story last week. A few children were able to recall parts of the story-which was lovely to hear!

We have been practising our fine motor control by threading with beads and developing our pencil control using the white board markers.

Outside the children continued their love for watering in our nature garden and I'm pleased to say the flowers, strawberries and beans are growing!

To practise our number recognition this week in the water tray, the children enjoyed catching the ducks with their net to discover what number was written underneath! We also challenged the children to see if they could build their own house using the big foam blocks, it was lovely to see some of the children working together and sharing their enjoyment with their peers

Acorn (Nursery am and pm)

This week we have continued with our topic 'How does that building stay up?' and we have been talking about different types of homes. We have enjoyed reading the story of, 'The Three Little Pigs' and have talked about different kinds of homes that people and animals live in. We have made up some actions for the story as well, see if your child can show you! We have made collages of houses from straw, sticks and bricks, and in outdoor learning we made houses for toy farm animals from sticks, straw, leaves and wooden blocks. We have been writing numbers on laminated doors in maths. Can your child look at the number on their house door and upload a photo to Seesaw or bring in a photo of their door to talk about next week?

Next week we will be reading 'Hansel and Gretel', and talking about the different houses in the story.

Maple and Beech News (Reception)

In maths this week we have been looking at shapes again, talking about the properties of different shapes and seeing if we can match shapes to pictures of them in different orientations. We have also been exploring making shape patterns with tangrams and building with 3D wooden shapes. We have made some amazing construction. In English we been reading the story of 'Tiddler' and thinking about all the rhyming words we can hear in the story. Challenge us to think of strings of rhyming words e.g snail, tail, whale, trail. We also made up our own amazing stories based on the fibs Tiddler told at school.

In science we have been working out which objects float or sink and what we could do to them to help them to float or sink.

In computing we have been logging on to Purple Mash using our individual logins and completing our fish paintings. We are getting really good at logging in by ourselves. In music we got out the chime bars and explored high and low sounds. We were like an orchestra and could make a really lovely sound.

In our creative area we collaged large fish and created underwater scenes using pastels.

As it gets hotter please make sure your child comes to school with a hat, sun cream and a water bottle each day.

Birch and Cherry (Year 1)

In year 1 this week we have continued to learn about The Great Fire of London. We have thought about what people would have seen, heard, smelt and felt at the time of the fire. In Maths we have been learning the place value of numbers to 100 and comparing numbers using the vocabulary more than less than and equal to. In computing we have had fun using a new App on the Ipads called Scratch, where we have to programme instructions to direct the movements of the animated cat character. In outdoor PE we have been practicing our athletic skills ready for sports day. In indoor PE we have been learning to keep in time to the music, 'March, March, March' from the Jungle book and made a simple dance routine. In Science we have continued recording the weather each day on our weather chart. Will it stay at a temperature above 25°C for the rest of the month?

When it is going to be a hot day it would really help us if you could please apply sun cream on your child before they come to school. For those children who have sun cream in school we will make sure that it is reapplied at lunchtime if necessary.

Hazel and Rowan News (Year 2)

This week in writing, Year 2 have read really enjoyed reading and learning about marine animals, and have answered comprehension questions about them, in full sentences, using the information texts to help. The children have been particularly inspired to research their own marine animal to start writing a leaflet.

In maths, both classes have been learning how to use directional language, including clockwise, anti-clockwise, quarter/half/whole turns, by directing each other, drawing maps on grids, and writing directions. This has linked nicely with Geography and Outdoor learning, in which they have been learning about and using the compass points, including Northwest/Northeast/Southwest, and using compasses. They have also re-capped previous learning about 2D and 3D shapes by creating posters about them, and sorting them in different ways.

In science, Year 2 have learnt about the lifecycle of humans, and in History, have learnt about the explorer Christopher Columbus.
