#### **Little Acorns Pre-Nursery**

This week in Little Acorns our focus has been practising how to share well with others. We have been playing in small groups helping each other to build houses using the magnetic shapes and seeing if we can name the different shapes used.

We have challenged the children this week with a problem-solving activity using tweezers, pom-poms, coloured pots and empty bottles! They were encouraged to use these items as they wished too.

Our fine motor skills were used this week at the playdough table- the children were encouraged to see if they could snip the playdough into small sections using our safety scissors independently.

Outside we had a builders table with tools such as hammers and golf tees. We talked about how we use tools and what the tools are used for. The children enjoyed role-playing builders.

We continued our visits to 'big nursery' this week. It's lovely to see the children's confidence growing in the outdoor space. The children are excited to go and wave to the other children and staff as we pass.

#### **Acorns Nursery**

This week we have continued with our topic 'How does that building stay up?' and we have been talking about different sizes of homes. We have enjoyed the Squash and a Squeeze and Hansel and Gretel story and have talked about different kinds of homes that people and animals live in. We have made pig faces and models, and in outdoor learning we made rubbings from sticks, straw, leaves and wooden blocks. Next week we will be learning about the Sandcastle story by Mick Inkpen, and talking about castles.

## **Maple and Beech News (Reception)**

In maths this week we have been learning to double numbers and see how this is making a number twice as big. We have used reflections of coins in mirrors, making spots on butterflies then folding and doubling them, domino patterns and dice to help us double numbers 1 to 6.

In English we been reading the story of 'The fish who could wish' and writing sentences about what we would wish for.

In outdoor learning we have begun to whittle using peelers. We whittled some sticks into magic wands. In computing we have using the beebot app to program. We read the book of 'Commotion in the Ocean' and added sound effects in music.

In our creative area we made foil fish and wishing jars.

It was lovely to see how excited the children were about move up day and we look forward to hearing their stories on Monday.

On Monday 28<sup>th</sup> we will be doing our spellathon, please have one more practice with the words this weekend.

As it gets hotter please make sure your child comes to school with a hat, sun cream and a water bottle each day.

# **Birch and Cherry News (Year 1)**

This week has been an exciting week. The children spent Friday visiting their new teacher and class in Year 2. We talked about the move up day with the children before hand and discussed how we felt about it. In English we have been discussing what we have learnt about over the year, what we have enjoyed doing and our favourite piece of work. In Maths we have continued to look at comparing numbers and understanding place value. We also started to look at directional language and full turns, half turns and quarter turns.

In Geography we have been comparing the different human and physical features of Burghfield and London. We have created water colour paintings of London landmark in the style of JMW Turner. The children are enjoying using the IPADS to create algorithms on Scratch Junior. In the next couple of weeks, we are going to be building some London Landmarks out of junk modelling so if you have any cereal boxes, different sized boxes tubes then please could you bring them in.

#### **Hazel and Rowan News (Year 2)**

It was so strange not to see the Year 2 children in school today! We hope they had a wonderful time at Garland Junior's and are excited for the year ahead!

In English this week we have been completing our Ocean leaflets. The children have learnt a lot about the different layers of the Ocean, the creatures that can be discovered in these layers and the important ways we can look after our Oceans! I wonder if any children can remember how much of the earths surface is covered in water?

In maths, the children have been recapping their knowledge of fractions, addition and subtraction and place value this week ready to complete our end of term assessments. We are incredibly impressed by how much they have remembered and can apply to solve all the challenging problems!


