#### **Little Acorns Pre-Nursery**

The children were delighted to discover the Easter activities in the nursery this week. In the small world we had 'Easter Bunny land' where different sized bunnies could hunt for glitter Easter eggs. The children were encouraged to use the positional language skills whilst they played 'hunt the egg'. In our tuff tray we had a sensory egg activity where the children were able to search through different material to find eggs of different varieties. We used our language skills to describe the feel of the fabric. We used our maths skills to describe the different sizes of the eggs and the patterns on them to. In the mark making area the children were encouraged to make controlled marks by focusing whilst tracing over patterns on egg shaped paper, using coloured pens and pencils. Whilst practicing our sitting and listening skills the children have enjoyed listening to different Easter stories, a firm favourite this week has been 'Egg hunt'where the Easter bunny has to travel through different obstacles to find his eggs!

#### Acorn (Nursery am and pm)

This week Acorns children have been exploring the book 'Chickens Aren't The Only Ones', and learning about which other animals lay eggs, and we have been amazed at the shapes and sizes of different eggs! We have enjoyed watching our caterpillars go into their cocoons. Our cress has grown well, and on Wednesday we learnt how to make cress sandwiches, spreading the butter carefully on the bread with a knife - everyone ate their sandwiches all up, I think the children were all hungry after Outdoor Learning! In phonics we have practised blending and segmenting letter sounds with magnetic letters, and in maths we have explored making shape pictures. We have practised our scissor skills by drawing around and cutting out different shapes.

Next week we will be learning about the Easter story and enjoying different Easter crafts.

## Maple and Beech News (Reception)

In Reception this week we have read the story of 'The Tiny Seed'. We used colourful semantics to say and write sentences about the story. We thought about what happens in the different seasons and the conditions that plants need to grow.

In maths, we have continued making more complex patterns and exploring numbers to 10 with Numicon.

In science, we have sorted foods into those that are healthy and unhealthy. In outdoor learning we have continued practising our sawing skills and have begun to make fences for our wild area. If you have any long branches of hazel or willow that we could use to weave into our fences we would be very grateful.

Please can we remind you that children should have water and not juice in their water bottles and that they need a change of clothes in their bags, as they can get wet and muddy outside at times.

## **Birch and Cherry (Year 1)**

We have had a busy week in Year 1. The children really enjoyed the disco on Tuesday. We have been rehearsing for our Easter Assembly which we will be recording and then uploading the link to seesaw next Thursday. The children should have come home with their words this week please can you help them practise.

In English the children have enjoyed writing their own fact file for an animal. The children enjoyed finding out some facts about different animals. We have been looking at fact families in maths e.g 2+6=8, 6+2=8, 8-2=6, 8-6=2. The children have been practising counting in 2's and 5's this week. Ask the children to show you, their counting.

During outdoor learning and as part as our Science we were discussing camouflage. The children had to hunt for different items which were camouflaged in the outdoor area. In RE, we have been learning about the Easter Story and what happened to Jesus when he came to Jerusalem.

In PHSE, we have been celebrating our differences and learning about famous people who have overcome barriers to be successful.

## Hazel and Rowan (Year 2)

What a great week we've had this week! It was lovely to see all the children enjoying themselves at the school disco on Tuesday – we saw some great moves on the dancefloor!

In English this week, we've been writing a flower fact file. The children have been working extra hard on their presentation skills, and some have even used non-fiction books and Iz-pads to find out extra information about their chosen flower. Ask your child if they can tell you a fantastic fact about the flower they chose to write about! We're really proud of all the hard work they've put in.

In maths, our week has been spilt between continuing with our measuring topic and completing our maths end-of-term assessments. Well done to all the children for putting into practice everything they've learned in maths this year and trying so hard with the assessments. In ICT, we've continued to practice making pictograms using the J2E program on the I-pads, whilst in geography we've learned about physical and human features and the children have used their knowledge of maps to draw an aerial map of where they live.

We have continued to work through the Blue Blyton bundle with Sir Linkalot.
