We will be looking at different types of buildings and their uses, focusing on the buildings in the village of Burghfield. We will be talking about different types of houses and what rooms we might find inside, for example, bedrooms, kitchens, and bathrooms.

It would be wonderful if you could share a picture of your child and their home. Pictures can be sent to the school email, where we can print and display your child's picture.

Please can we remind parents to bring back their child's school library book each week.

This week the children have enjoyed making bird feeders for RSPB 'The Big Bird Watch'. We have also enjoyed the story of The Three little pigs.

We have lots of new faces joining the nursery, so it's really important to name/ label your child's property to save confusion, yes, even down to wellie boots!

Acorns Class

Welcome back. We hope you all had a lovely break and Christmas.

This term our topic is 'How tall is that building?'

We are learning the story of 'The Three Little Pigs'. This week we have learnt how to retell the story using story language signs (Pie Corbett) and using different voices to be the characters.

In maths, we have been putting the numbers 1-10 in order. The children are very good at recognising the numbers in a sequence.

In outdoor learning we found lots of sticks to build our own stick house! We also practised our rules for outdoor learning, remembering to not walk through the fire circle and to gather in a circle when the adult calls 'sticky toes'. Well done!

Maple and Beech News (Reception)

This week in Reception we have been working on phase 3 sounds – z & zz, qu, ch and sh. We have put some phoneme (sound) spotter stories related to these sounds on Seesaw. Can you read it together and find the sounds within the words? This doesn't need to be printed out to complete the activity.

In English, we have been learning the story of, 'The Little Red Hen' off by heart and then changing the characters to make our own version of the story. We have labelled pictures and captions from the story and drawn our own story maps. We have used puppets to retell the story. We also made collaged little red hens using a variety of media.

In maths, we have been working on consolidating our knowledge of rapid number bonds to 5. We have also used the language of more than and fewer than. We have played lots of games to help us get faster at this. We have put a game idea on seesaw if you would like to practise this at home.

We looked at pictures in the story 'Peepo' and discussed the differences between long ago and now.

Please remember to put both shorts and trousers in for P.E. This term we are doing gymnastics and the children need to be in shorts for safety reasons.

Birch and Cherry (Year 1)

Year 1 have had a great first full week back!

Our new topic is 'To Infinity and Beyond' and we have been reading a selection of story books and engaging in the roleplay, order to extend their space vocabulary and encourage imaginative thought to add into our writing.

In English, our genre focus is narratives and we started by reading the story, 'Beegu'. The children rehearsed and retold the story orally, explored the characters feelings and emotions before rewriting it in their own words. Can the children tell you the story?

Our Maths focus has been teen numbers and the children have explored them using concrete and pictorial representations as well as looking at one more and one less.

The artist we are exploring is Joan Miro and we looked at how we can sketch different lines and abstract shapes.

Following our theme of 'Space', in History we are learning about Neil Armstrong and his epic journey to the Moon. The children were very excited to watch the live footage filmed of this journey. They will be using this knowledge in their future English writing.

Reminders:

PE is on a Monday and Tuesday. Children require both shorts for gym and long trousers for outdoor PE as well as suitable trainers and a warm jumper and coat.

Outdoor learning for Birch class is on a Wednesday and Friday for Cherry. Please ensure the children have wellies in school and some waterproof clothing.

Reading records and phonics books need to be brought into school every.

Hazel and Rowan (Year 2)

It has been so lovely to have the children in school for the past week and two days. The children came in ready to learn and have settled so well into the new term.

In maths, we have started our new unit - money! The children have been recalling the value of each coin/note, adding up amounts of money to find a total and finally choosing different coins/notes to make a given total. As everyone seems to be using cards these days, many of the children have not used money in real-life contexts much at all - if you get the chance over the next few weeks, why not encourage your child to use their knowledge of money to help you with the weekly shop!

In English, we have started reading Roald Dahl's book, 'George's Marvellous Medicine'. The children have been loving listening to all of the disgusting ingredients that have gone in to George's medicine and enjoyed predicting what the concoction might do the grandma. They also thought about the different emotions felt by the characters throughout the story so far.

To kick off our history topic, we had a very special visitor this week. A nurse came in to school to tell the children all about her job. We learned that being a nurse is NOT very glamorous, in fact in can be quite disgusting. We got the chance to see some of the special equipment she uses and asked lots of great questions to find out more about nursing. Throughout this term we will be learning about famous nurses throughout history, including Florence Nightingale, Mary Seacole and Edith Cavell. Thank you so much to Nicola for giving up her time to come in and talk to us.

Finally, in outdoor learning we learned how to safely build and put out a small fire. The children have discussed the important of safety around the fire and how dangerous fire can be if we are not careful. At the end of the session we collected up the charcoal left over from the fire and we will be using this to create artwork next week.
