Using the internet safely and positively is a key message that we promote in school, and celebrating Safer Internet Day is a great opportunity for us to re-emphasise the online safety messages we deliver throughout the year. Little Acorns Class

What a busy, noisy week in Little Acorns! The children have been learning all about different vehicles, their names and functions. In particular, we have been focusing on vehicles that help us, such as Fire engines, Ambulances and police cars. The children have shown excellent listening skills as we read various information books explaining all about the different vehicles in question. Lots of 'nee nahs' were heard throughout the week! The children enjoyed dressing up as firemen, ambulance staff and policemen, playing role games both indoors and outside.

The children had the opportunity to put their problem-solving skills to the test and attempted to retrieve the coloured pom-poms trapped inside differently shaped bottles. We saw some excellent thought processing and lots of twisting and unscrewing of lids and caps.

We really have encouraged the children to try to put their coats on independently this week, using the special nursery trick.... Lay your child's coat down on the floor with the hood end next to their feet. See if they can impress you this weekend with their magic skills!

Acorns Class

This week in Acorns we have been learning all about different homes. In Literacy, we read a story that showed us how many different types of homes there were. The children came up with some very good ideas of who could live in the homes we saw.

"It is for an alien!" said Flavia when looking at a picture of the moon and space!

In maths, we have been learning about patterns. We used TOPMARKS on the white board to finish the pattern on the train game. We used unifix cubes to try and make our own patterns- remembering that a pattern is something that repeats again and again.

We used our knowledge of pattern in music to create patterns with different sounds and actions. The children loved playing the xylophones!

Maple and Beech News (Reception)

This week in English we have been working on the sounds igh, oa, oo (as in boot) and oo (as in look). We have been consolidating our work on curly letters in handwriting -c, o, a, d, g, e and s. We have retold the story of the Three Billy Goats Gruff using puppets, story maps and written sentences about the story. We have used loose parts to make troll faces.

In maths, we have been working on the composition of 6, 7 and 8. That is knowing that 6 could be made up of 5 and 1, 4 and 2, 3 and 3 etc. We have been using dice patterns and dominoes to help us with this.

We have begun talking about safety when out on the road – stranger danger and road safety, linked to our walk next week.

Birch and Cherry (Year 1)

Another successful week in year 1 full of fantastic learning.

The children have been using their learning through History to start generating ideas for their final piece of writing next week.

We have continued to practise using our number bonds to add and explore doubles in Maths. The children have been given plenty of opportunity to use concrete resources to support their learning.

In RE, we explored another parable (The Two Sons) and the children had the opportunity to act out the story to support their understanding. We spent some time discussing the different religions we have and how learning about them develops the value of tolerance. This is so important to have within the fantastic multicultural society we live in.

The children are in the process of designing and making their alien vehicles. Any junk modelling you have in your recycling (small boxes/containers no larger than a cereal box) would be greatly appreciated to support them with this task.

Reminder:

We have had several children arriving with no PE kit or parts of it missing and unfortunately, we don't have enough spare.

Indoor: coloured t-shirt and shorts (for safety reasons it has be shorts)Outdoor: coloured t-shirt, long warm trousers, jumper socks and appropriate trainers.

Hazel and Rowan (Year 2)

This week in year 2 we have been continuing our writing topic on George's Marvellous Medicine. This week the children have written diary entries from the point of view of the characters within the story. First, we looked at examples of diaries and picked out key features that we would need to include, such as first person, past tense and chronological order. Next, we practiced using these features in our own writing. Finally, we put our ideas together in to a detailed diary entry. We are so impressed with how well the children's writing has turned out. Keep it up year 2!

In maths we have continued to work on multiplication and division. The children have learned how to use arrays to solve multiplication problems, including word problems. They have also begun to think about what is meant by the word 'division' and how we can use written methods to solve division problems.


In geography, we have been comparing our local area to a non-European location very different to where we live. We have been studying the water village of Kampong Ayer, in Brunei. We have learned that the weather in Kampong Ayer is hot and wet all year round because of how close it is to the equator. We also thought about how living on a river would affect the types of houses people would live in and how they would travel. The children seem to have really enjoyed this topic so far - ask them to tell you about life in Kampong Ayer.

Finally, in art we have been looking at the work of Quentin Blake, who illustrated many of Roald Dahl's children's books. We practiced recreating some of his most famous characters in his linework style and then used water colour paints to add colour to our work. The work the children produced is fantastic.

Breakfast Bees and Bumblebees

The children enjoyed playing card games. We like Go Fish and used different types of cards to play it with.

The children have been having lots of fun dressing up this week in a variety of costumes! We would like to say a big thank you to the Hughes family for their very generous donation of dressing up costumes. The children had great fun sorting these out and trying them on. THANK YOU VERY MUCH!
