Little Acorns Class

In the final week of our topic, 'How does that building stay up?' the children enjoyed observing the differently shaped buildings around the school grounds whilst going for walks. In the small world tray, the children have explored Happyland castles. Outside, they have been working collaboratively to build beautiful sandcastles decorated with different-sized shells. In Literacy this week, we have been reading the Story 'Sandcastles' by Mick Inkpen.

The children have been learning about different emotions this week as it's child mental health week- The children all enjoyed participating in choosing a daily emotion card to help express their feelings to their friends.

Acorns Class

This week in Acorns we have been learning the story of 'The 3 Billy Goats Gruff.' We read different versions of the traditional tale and discussed the characters and setting of the story. Once we were familiar with the story, we used our Pie Corbett actions to retell the story without a book! The children are very good at remembering the different actions.

In maths we were learning to count carefully, moving the items, and touching them one at a time slowly. It is a very tricky skill, but the children were good at understanding not to rush their counting!

This week we learnt about Safer Internet Day. We talked about why we use computers and how we get information from them. We also discussed that sometimes messages pop up on the screen that we don't need. We talked about what ways we can keep ourselves safe on the internet and watched a clip from 'Buddy the Dog'... you can find this clip on You Tube to re-watch with your child.

We enjoyed our last outdoor learning session with 'Smores' using the Year 1 outdoor fire circle this time!

Laura Hooke or Charmaine Kelly This week we have been learning the sounds ar, or, ur, ow and oi in phonics. We have been working on our handwriting with the letters r, n and m (which we refer to as one-arm robot letters, in case you hear your child call them that!)

Linked to children's mental health week we have been reading the story of 'The Colour Monster.' We painted our own colour monsters and wrote sentences describing them.

We had a fantastic walk around the local area, the children walked really sensibly and remembered all the rules about walking safely. They were really animated about all the places they knew as we walked round. Thank you to those parents and grandparents who came with us.

In maths we have been working on our quick recall of the numbers that make up 6, 7 and 8.

We hope everyone has a restful half term.

Birch and Cherry (Year 1)

Can you believe that we have already completed one half term?! The children have worked extremely hard and we are so proud of them.

This week they finished writing a non-chronological report in English about Neil Armstrong, using all the amazing facts they learnt in History.

In Maths, we have been working on subtraction as well as looking at fact families.

During PSHE we discussed ways in which the children can focus on keeping their bodies and minds healthy during half term and beyond. Hopefully they will share some of these suggestions with you.

As part of 'Safer Internet Week' the children showed great insight in how to keep themselves safe online and what information should never be shared.

We wrapped up our History unit about Space by completing our reports on the comparison of Neil Armstrong's walk on the Moon and Tim Peake's trip to the International Space Station.

Wishing you all a happy half term and a well-deserved rest to the children. We look forward to seeing them at the start of the Spring 2 term and hope that includes some warmer weather.

Hazel and Rowan (Year 2)

As always, it has been a busy week for year 2!

In English, the children have been studying a book called 'Journey'. It is a picture book about a girl who goes on an exciting adventure. The children enjoyed looking at the book and thinking about where they might go on their own adventure. We planned and wrote our own versions of the story. The children used wonderful vocabulary to describe the different settings in the story and worked hard to present their work perfectly!

In maths we have continued our topic on multiplication and division. The children have learned how to use arrays and sharing hoops as written methods for solving problems. They have also begun to think about how they can use their knowledge of counting in 2s, 5s and 10s to solve problems too. If you have a spare moment, please practise counting with your child in different jumps.

In history the children have finished their topic on famous nurses who had a big impact on nursing today. They have learned about Florence Nightingale, Mary Seacole and Edith Cavell. The children had some really in-depth discussions about the importance of hygiene, the discrimination against Mary Seacole and the importance of treating everyone equally. We have been so impressed by their enthusiasm for this topic.


Finally, in RE the children have been learning about Judaism. They have learned about the significance of the Sabbath day and the Shabbat meal, the differences and similarities between churches and synagogues and some of the different traditions followed by Jewish people. They have also learned about the plagues of Egypt and why Passover is still celebrated today.

We have had such a busy half term and thoroughly enjoyed our 'Muck, Mess and Mixtures' topic. We hope you all have a lovely, restful half term break and come back ready for our new topic - 'The Scented Garden.'
