## **Little Acorns Class**

What a lovely welcome back from half term. It's been wonderful to see the children and hear about their adventures from the break.

This term our topic is 'Are eggs alive?' We have been enjoying the small world farmyard and have been thinking about animal names and the noises they make. We have also been reading the story 'Oh Dear' by Rod Campbell.

We enjoyed lots of singing, especially the family favourite - 'Old McDonald'. The children have also enjoyed cutting and sticking mixed materials onto differently shaped paper at the creative table.

We talked about different fruit and vegetables and why they are important, and the children enjoyed some food-based puzzles.

Outside, the sensory tray was a big hit! It was wonderful to see the children investigating independently with the different textures and smells.

## **Acorns Class**

Welcome back! We hope you all had a restful break. This term in nursery our topic is 'Are Eggs Alive?' We started the topic by talking about what we already know about eggs. The children were very enthusiastic, telling us that they like eating eggs. The children also told us that eggs come from chickens and dinosaurs! Over the course of the term, we will be looking at which animals do and do not lay eggs.

Our book this week is 'Farmer Duck'. We talked about the characters in the story and where the story is set. The children then enjoyed painting the different animals from the story.

We are trying really hard with our name writing. We practise twice a week, making sure we hold our pencil using the 'Beaky Bird' grip.

In maths we have looked at a fives frames. We put a different number of dots in the frame and the children were very quick at recognising the amount without any dots, always having to count.

Next Thursday is World Book Day. Each year group will come in dressed up as characters from books by their author of the term. Our author this term is Jez Alborough. His books are centred around animals ...dogs, monkeys, giraffes, bears to name few. If you need any suggestions please ask nursery staff. This week we have been learning the sounds air, ear, ure and er in phonics. We have been working on our handwriting with the letters h, b, p and k (which we refer to as down and back up again letters, in case you hear your child call them that!)

To start off our new topic of 'Things that grow' we have been reading the story of 'Jack and the Beanstalk'. We acted out being Jack and imagined what we might see at the top of the beanstalk. We drew pictures and wrote sentences about it. We have also looked at beans and seeds and planted some beans and peas of our own.

In maths we have been learning about measures. We have been comparing our heights, measuring and comparing length, thought about days of the week and what we do on each day and then we have started to think about time in terms of what could we do in different amounts of time e.g. how many star jumps can you do in one minute?

# Birch and Cherry (Year 1)

It's been a busy first week of the half-term in Year 1. Our new topic is 'Animals Around the world'.

In English we have been learning and orally rehearsing the story of 'Cinnamon' – a story set in Asia, about a princess and a tiger. See if your child can recall the main details and events of the story. All the children made their own 'story map' and they worked in groups to discuss the sequence of the story to create a 'story mountain' as a plan for writing.

Our grammar focus this week was learning the rules to add the suffix -ing to the end of verbs. Can your child explain how to add –ing to the verbs 'cut' and 'think'?

In maths we have been revising different methods to support our addition and subtraction. We have used part-whole models, tens frames, pictures and number lines.

We were learning how to classify / group animals by common features in science this week. The children worked in pairs to decide their own ways of sorting a selection of animal pictures. They were then introduced to the 6 main animal groups of **reptiles, mammals, bird, fish, amphibians and invertebrates.** We began to learn some features of each group.

In art, we started to create a water colour background for a sketch of a hare. Our focus artist was 'Albrecht Durer' and his painting of the 'Young Hare'.

In history, we really enjoyed watching some video clips to learn about the life and important work of the naturalist and broadcaster 'David Attenborough'.

### Hazel and Rowan (Year 2)

Welcome back Year 2!

We have been looking at the book 'Into the Forest' by Anthony Browne. The children enjoyed making predictions about what might happen next. They also liked that the author has used characters from other books in his story.

In maths we have continued working on multiplication and division using the 2, 5 and 10's times tables. The children are becoming more confident with working out the number sentences and how they can record this in different ways.

Our Outdoor Learning and Geography this term will be linked as we are going to be looking at aerial views and maps and labelling a key for a map. The children had fun looking at the maps we gave them and trying to find the hidden letters.

In computing this term, we are looking at handling data and pictograms. The children will be learning about how we can input data into computers to help us store and retrieve information.


We are doing dance this term in our indoor PE sessions and we are going to be learning some Country Dancing songs which we hope to perform to the rest of the school.
