Little Acorns Class

The book 'The Dinosaur That Pooped a Rainbow' has been enjoyed by the children this week in Little Acorns. They have been role playing with dinosaurs in the small world area as well as moulding playdough dinosaurs.

We have been learning a new song 'Pitter Patter Raindrops' and making marks on raindrop paper with our lovely writing skills as well as continuing to discover more weather phenomena.

The children have been busily creating Duplo masterpieces on the carpet, continuing to develop their sharing skills with the toy cars and garage and moving their bodies to music as well as improving our yoga skills.

In Maths, we have been making patterns out of 2D shapes including squares, triangles, diamonds, rectangles and circles. There have been lots of shells around the Nursery this week. We have been using them in Maths to put them in order of size, and to decorate our beautiful sandcastles, as well as to draw around on the white board. We have also been drawing around other shapes including squares, triangles, rectangles and circles.

Outside, the children have enjoyed role playing celebrations, dancing with rainbow scarves and blowing/popping bubbles, exploring the water wheels in the water tray, crawling through tunnels and inside tents, and having fun with diggers in the sandpit.

Acorns Class

This week in Acorns Class, we have revisited all the things we have learnt this year.

We have re-read lots of stories from all our 'authors of the term' and the children were very good at remembering the author names and some key facts about each one.

We have continued to practise our name writing and number writing this week and are very proud of how independent all of the children are becoming.

In Science, we recapped on all of the different experiments from the year. The children said the favourite ones were the volcano and the skittles experiment!

It was lovely to see so many parents come in for open afternoon. I think you will all agree the children have worked very hard this year and this shows in their learning and positive behaviour around the school. Well done for a fantastic year and we hope you all have a lovely summer!

Maple and Beech News (Reception)

This week we have made our own class information books about sea creatures. We also had a demonstration from Mrs Rose about how to paint a fish onto silk and then had a go ourselves. Our finished paintings look amazing.

In Maths, we have talked about position and direction, making maps from stories we have learnt this year, our journey to school and treasure maps.

In Geography, we have looked at world, UK and Mudeford maps, recapping some of the key vocabulary we have learnt this year.

It was lovely to see so many parents on Wednesday and the children loved sharing their wonderful work from the year. We are so proud of how much they have learnt!

Birch and Cherry (Year 1)

It's been a busy last week in Year 1!

In English, the children have been writing facts about The Elizabeth Tower / Big Ben, using sub-headings to split their work into organised sections of information. It's been great to see how much their independence for writing has progressed from the beginning of the year!

To conclude their learning about The Great Fire of London, the children have thought about the impact of the fire and what changes have since been made to prevent or improve the response to such an event. See if your child can describe how buildings in London have changed or how the fire service has improved.

In Geography, the children have been comparing London to Rio de Janeiro in Brazil. Can your child recall some of the physical and human geography features of Rio de Janeiro? Can they say how it is similar or different to London? The children have enjoyed learning how to use Google Maps to explore these cities, so perhaps, with close supervision, they could use this some more over the holidays to expand their geographical knowledge.

In art, the children have been adding the finishing touches to their paintings and drawings of London monuments. We hope you enjoyed seeing the variety of artwork they have produced this year when visiting on Wednesday!

I'm sure you'll agree, from seeing their books and work on display, the children have worked so incredibly hard this year and we are very proud of their achievements. Thank you for all your support at home.
